Ed Carson introduced Sam Davidson who spoke on the fishing industry in Maine. There are 245 fishing boats and 20 processors of fishing products, with 67% being shipped out of state. There has been an imbalanced growth over the last several years resulting in low profits. Government subsidized (100%) of the boats, resulting in rapid expansion and followed this with limiting the size of the catch. An example of government's conflicting forces. The fishermen have not helped because they tend to overfish a particular species and have been a supplier to Massachusetts, who control the process. Added to all of the above, low profits have contributed to the fisherman's inability to keep up with modern technology to be more cost effective.

Structure problems generally involve policies that are either not clear or too specific, resulting in being counterproductive. Policies should be written to provide guidance. People problems that contribute to ineffectiveness is the inability to listen. "Effective listening" is a key. Some reasons why people don't listen are: 1) too much communication; 2) unable or unwilling to listen--figure it will be repeated if important; 3) arguing mentally so one does not listen properly; and 4) most of us are free in giving advice but not listening to it.

Dick Goodine introduced his partner, Mark Filler, who spoke to us on the Tax Recovery Act of 1981. There have been some very dynamic changes. Mark could not scratch the surface in the time allotted, but did cover a few of the features:

- New depreciation laws 3-5-10 year write-off.
- Extended carry forward feature for net operating loss and tax credits to 15 years.
- Investment tax credit applies to rehabilitated commercial property.
- Charitable contributions for a business increased the limit from 5% to 10% of "bottom line".
- Gifts (non-cash) to employees allowed up to a \$400 value.
- Subchapter S corporations are now allowed 25 shareholders.

There are many other features to the new law. Worth looking into. I'm sure you will find one that applies.

He has a remarkable command of English and, after the meeting, I asked him if he could translate the word "OLE" into English. I have never been able to do it. Diego can't do it either.
