The total sales came to \$38,748. This represented 2245 trees and 400 wreaths. After deducting costs for the trees, wreaths and other expenses of \$27,278 we had net income of \$11,470 This is 13.1% above the amount we raised during the 1983 Christmas Season.

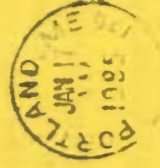

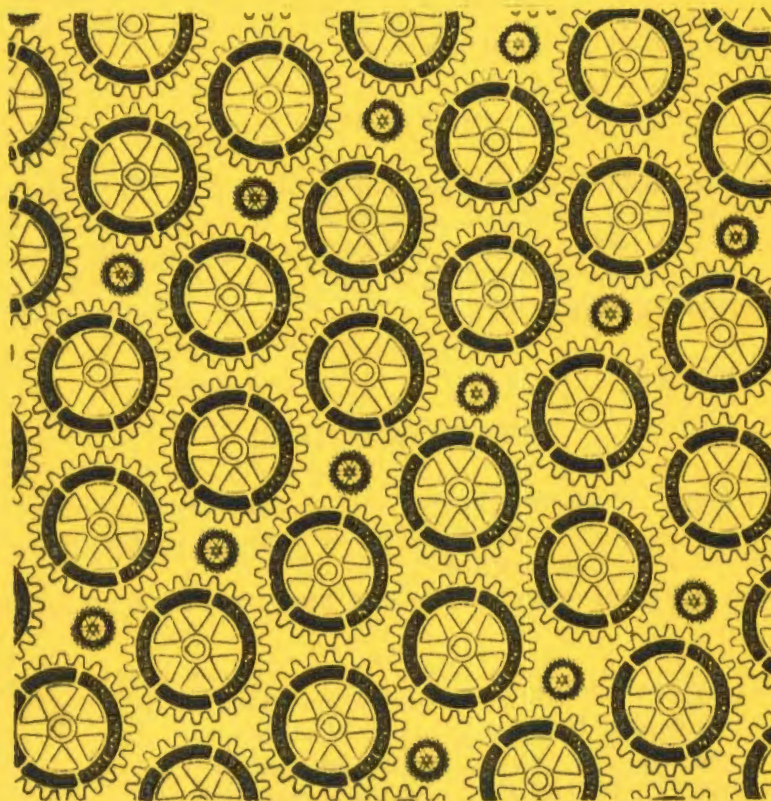

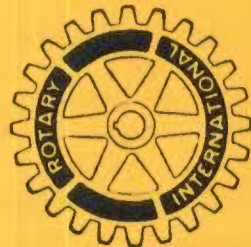

Mr Ishkanian talked about the Great Northern Paper Company's proposed Big Ambejackmockamus Falls hydroelectric project. The Big A Project is located 30 miles northwest of Millinocket on the west branch of the Penobscot River.

His group disputes the costs of various alternatives that Great Northern has available. They claim that the best alternative is purchased power from Bangor Hydro.
