THE ROTARY EMBLEM

Rotary's early emblem was a simple wacon wheel in motion with dust representing "civilization and movement". It was designed in 1905 by Montague M. Bear of the Chicago Club. Most of the early clubs adopted the wheel in one form or another.

The present wheel with 24 coos and six spokes was adopted in 1923. The keyway was also added to signify that the wheel was a "worker and not an idler".

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL THE YEARS 1905-1915

Rotary's first ten years were a quest for acquaintance. The efforts of a young lawyer to find a small and friendly world inside a hugh and indifferent city led to his discovery that there were many others in the need of friendship. Three years after Paul Harris and three friends founded the Rotary Club of Chicago in 1905, a second Rotary Club was established in San Francisco. The next year three more clubs were established on the west coast and another in New York City. In 1911, Rotary became international with the founding of a club in Winnipeg, Canada, and in 1912 crossed the Atlantic to form clubs in London, Dublin, and Belfast. By 1915 there were more than 180 clubs in eight countries with a total membership of nearly 21,000.

The early members' volunteer spirit soon led them into many kinds of community projects and then, in a natural progression, into service to other communities in need. As early as 1913, the 50 Rotary Clubs then in existence contributed \$25,000 for flood relief in two U.S. midwestern states.

The assembly is on Saturday at the Sheraton Inn, South Portland. Registration is from 8 to 8:30 am with the General Session starting at 8.30 am to 4 pm.

In the evening there will be a dance to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the Portland Rotary Club. Members are encouraged to attend — see Bob Carson about this event.

THE ROTARY FOUNDATION

The Rotary Foundation has been called Rotary's chief agency for international service. The Foundation – which is dependent entirely on voluntary contributions sends about 1,000 young scholars abroad each year. It also enables teams of young professionals and business persons to study and explore business and professional life in other countries, and it funds the Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) program of Rotary International. In fact, since 1947, The Rotary Foundation has disbursed more than \$100 million in international scholarship and other programs.



All these and other activities of The Rotary Foundation — as well as its history and development — are set forth in one of the volumes in the Rotary Basic Library (R.I. publication 920). This compendium of Rotary information is recommended for reference, ideas, inspiration, and a better general understanding of Rotary and

its work in the modern world.

The set comprises seven volumes - Focus on Rotary, an introduction to the entire subject, one on each Avenue of Service (volumes 2 to 5), volume 6 on Youth Activities, and volume 7 on The Rotary Foundation. Each of the volumes is indexed for easy use and may be purchased as a set or separately. The set can also be borrowed from the Club. Anyone wishing to borrow this set should see Jim Doughty or Bob Carson.







These generous donations provided the financial support that enabled the Foundation to grant 18 Graduate Scholarships its first significant International Service program. Today, those who continue this tradition of honoring Paul Harris by contributing \$1,000 - or for whom \$1,000 is donated in their honor or memory - are designated Paul Harris Fellows. By the early 1980's there were more than 75,000 Fellows in 120 countries. Prominent among them were Pope John Paul II; Mother Teresa, of Calcutta, India; former U.S. President Gerald R. Ford; H.R.H. Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh; Dr. Jonas Salk, developer of the Salk anti-Polio vaccine; Pele, world renowned soccer player; dignitaries, and many heads of state. Our club has 4 fellows. They are recognized on our roster.

Persons may also contribute toward the required \$1,000 over a period of ten years as part of the Paul Harris Sustaining Member plan, initiated by the Trustees of The Rotary Foundation in 1968.





COMMUNITY SURVEY

On April 27, 1985, our Rotary Club conducted a community survey throughout Cape Elizabeth and South Portland. We had members located at the transfer site and IGA in Cape Elizabeth, Shaws and Shop 'n Save in Mill Creek, and Shaws in the Maine Mall area. The purpose of the survey was to get feedback from citizens in the community as to what they felt were problems that existed, services needed, and overall unmet needs in both communities. We also asked people what they liked best about their community, their perception of what a service club should do and what knowledge they know about our Rotary Club.

I think we were surprised to learn that most people know very little about Rotary, and even less about what Rotary does. People aren't too familiar with what we do even after much effort we have put into the two communities.

Although the results of the survey are by no means scientific, we did elicit some very thoughtful comments and concerns from many. It seems that most people feel the communities are not providing enough for our young people in the form of recreation services and programs to keep them involved. The same can be said for our senior citizens. Both communities feel that their roads are in pretty poor condition and would like some concerted efforts to get them in shape. Hopefully in the future we will be able to zero in on some of the needs that are in line with the goals and obectives of Rotary. That was the intended purpose of the survey.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Carroll Beck introduced Lt. Vail who is the supervisor of the Southern District of the Maine State Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Warden Service Program.

Since moose hunting was allowed a few years back there has been much controversy about the hunt including a referendum to ban moose hunting which failed. National interest was focused on the referendum. There is a declining number of hunters in the United States. There are 1000 permits - 900 for State residents and 100 for non-residents - issued each year and 850 moose will be harvested in this hunt. The herd is about 20,000 and could stand 4,000 hunted each year and the herd would remain the same.

Other game that is of concern are deer and bear. The bear population is on the increase since the spring bear hunt was eliminated some time ago. The population is in the 10 to 20 thousand range.
