LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

President Jim gave us a summation of the activities that took place during the 1984-1985 Rotary year he served as president.

In July 1984 the membership of the club was at 43 and we had a goal of 52 at the year end. We ended the year with 53. Although it did not yield many members the membership competition was a great educational tool in member awareness and resulted in 17 new members. Seven members terminated their membership.

Lack of Rotary information to the members was another problem area that was cured in part by a much improved club bulletin. A member questionaire provided provided guidance to the leadership in running the club.

Attendance fell short of desireable goals. The club had a high of 90.34% and a low of 79.52% in the monthly rankings. That out at us 8th and 22nd respectivly in a group of 64.

\$13,600 was dispersed from the treasury for many worthy projects and causes. A complete financial statement will be presented in the near future.

President Jim mentioned many members by name that were of a great help to him and the club in his year as president.

Maxine Brady, Executive Director of the Maine Safety Council, presented a plaque to President Jim recognizing the club's involvement in the 'Drinking, Driving & You' program that was presented at the Cape Elizabeth and South Portland high schools.



Herbert Taylor became Rotary International President; The Four-Way Test was assigned by him to Rotary, and Rotary entered four new countries - Ethiopia, Malawi, Turkey, and Zaire Republic.

THE KEY THAT OPENS ROTARY

Membership development is the equal responsibility of every member of our club. It's not just the job of the Menbership Development Committee. If our club is to grow, each of you must be sure to do his part to bring new men into Rotary. YOU ARE THE KEY that can open the door to Rotary for someone new, the way the door was opened to you.

Every minute, ten children die and another ten become lame, deaf, blind or mentally retarded from six diseases: polio, diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus, measles, and tuberculosis.

Perhaps the greater tragedy is that they are all preventable through immunization. Polio, in particular, has been virtually eradicated from developed nations due to the inexpensive and easily administered Sabin oral polio vaccine, named for its discoverer, Dr. Albert Sabin. In the U.S., for example, there are four reported cases of polio for every 100 million children annually.

In developing nations, in the absence of immunization programs, four children in every thousand are doomed to lameness from the disease, and an additional 50,000 children die each year from polio.

Rotary has responded to this inconscionable situation by taking on the most challenging commitment in its history; a twenty-year, \$120 million project to promote and assist polio immunization of all children before the year 2005, Rotary's 100th anniversary.



Lt Peter Ganser of the U S Coast Guard in South Portland was Joe Conroy's guest speaker.

The lighthouses that surround the coast of the United States many of which are automated are all scheduled to be that way by 1989. One disadvantage of having no one on duty is that the structures tend to get less care.

The coast guard controls all the lights on the Maine coast from Portland. In a many ways these automated lighthouses are more reliable than the manned ones and operating costs are substantially less.

PROPOSING A NEW MEMBER

The name of the candidate must be proposed to the club by the membership develoment committee or by an active, senior active, or past service member: The sponsor submits the man's name to the club's board of directors on a membership proposal card. The board sends the proposal card to the classifications committee and the membership committee. The former makes sure that there is an open classification on the roster and that the prospective member's business or profession is covered by that classification; the latter evaluates the candidate from the standpoint of character, business and social standing, and general To avoid any possible eligibility. embarrassment, the candidate's name is kept confidential throughout this preliminary procedure, and the candidate himself is not aware of these investigations. The membership committee appraises the proposed new member on these five points.

Is his character and reputation above reproach? Is the reputation of his firm exemplary? Is he "service-minded?" Can he meet the financial obligations of belonging to Rotary? Can he attend meetings regularly?

The membership committee and classification

committee report the results of their findings promptly to the club's board.

If the reports are favorable and the club's board approves them, the proposer and a member of Rotary information committee contacts the man and describes the many benefits that Rotary offers its members and what Rotary expects in return.

The candidate is then asked whether he would like to become a member of the club and, if so, if he is willing to have his application published to the club members. Next, he fills out the application. The name of the applicant, his business, and classification are mailed to members, often with an issue of the club bulletin. If there are no written objections received by the board within ten days, the time limit provided in the club by-laws, the candidate is accepted as a full member as soon as he pays his admission fee. On the other hand, if a club member objects in writing, the board considers the case, and votes on whether the man is to be elected to membership. The finale comes when the candidate is formally introduced by his sponsor and is inducted as a new member at a regular meeting of the club.

This procedure applies to applicants for active membership, including additional active members.

In an effort to immunize all children in the world against polio by the year 2005, Rotary's 100th anniversary, the Board of Directors and The Rotary Foundation Trustees of Rotary International have approved the following two-part plan of action during the period from 1985 to 2005:

- 1. Rotary will provide all polip vaccines necessary for up to five consecutive years for any approved city, state, country, or regional immunization program either as part of Ministries of Health annual days of immunization against polip, or through other delivery methods in support of the World Health Organization's Expanded Program on Immunization, UNICEF, or other agencies.
- 2. Rotary will make available to any developing country, upon invitation, a team of experts to help assess, plan, implement, and evaluate a plan for annual national days of immunization against polio. In each targeted country, a committee of Rotarians, in conjunction with Rotary's expert team and national and local health officials, will seek to motivate and utilize resources of the orivate business and professional sectors.







