WHAT IS ROTARY

Governor Sam Giftos reminds us that ROTARY sponsors ROTARACT, some 4000 service clubs for young adults between 18 and 28 in approximately 90 countries.

The first steps towards Rotary's Polio 2005 goal of immunizing all children against polio in the world have already been taken. Projects through the Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) program have been initiated or approved which will protect 23.5 million children in 16 countries, at a cost of \$4 million. And The Rotary Foundation has established a "Polio 2005 Fund", to which Rotary clubs, individual Rotarians, and the public may contribute in any amount. To meet Rotary's financial goal for Polio 2005, from \$100-120 million will need to be raised before 2005.

But money is only a part of the way Rotary is addressing the world problem of polio. The lack of human resources in general and management skills in particular have long impeded the progress of immunization in developing nations. Rotary will take a leadership role in all phases of the Polio 2005 project. District governors are encouraged to establish a "Polio 2005 committee", and encourage all clubs in their districts to form a similar committee to provide financial support, develop World Community Service, Special Grant and 3-H projects that affect polio immunization, and build public awareness of children's health needs.

There is a role in Polio 2005 for every Rotary club, every Interact and Rotaract club, and every Rotarian with a desire to join in Rotary's greatest challenge: to give a 100th anniversary present from Rotary to the world, a present of world health and human dignity.

POLIO 2005 : QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

What is Polio 2005?

It is a Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) project that will implement Rotary's goal of promoting and assisting polio immunization of all children worldwide by the year 2005, Rotary's 100th anniversary.

How much will this cost?

It is expected to cost approximately \$120 million over the twenty-year period.

How will this money be used?

For the costs of polio vaccines; storage, and distribution of such vaccines; and the development and encouragement of contri-

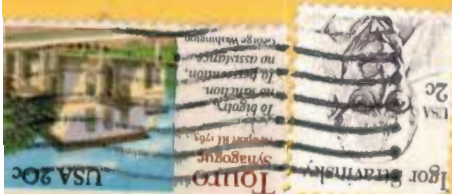

Sherry Huber, independent candidate for Governor of Maine, was the guest speaker that was introduced by Peter Drivas. Mrs Huber who has served three terms in the Maine House of Representatives, is a former president of the Maine Audubon Society. She spoke in opposition to the growing amount of debt that the state has issued.

She believes that the continuing issuance of debt is a giant step backwards from the somewhat arbitrary rule of issuing only 90% of the debt that is retired each year that was state policy for a few years.

There are six issues on this year's ballot.

1. \$15 million for water quality which raises \$20 million in matching federal fund which she supports.
2. \$4.3 million for centers for advanced technology which she is against.
3. \$20 mostly for highway and bridge improvements (\$19 million) which would generate \$77 million in federal aid which she supports.
4. \$850,000 for purchasing railroad lines which she is against.
5. \$2 million for restoration of historical buildings and involves local matching funds which she has no position.
6. \$2.2 million for equipment and land for VTIs which she has no position.

ROTARY FOUNDATION GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE

The Group Study Exchange program enables teams of business and professional people in different countries to exchange visits of several weeks to develop international friendships and learn new ideas, ways of life, and business or professional practices.

Over a two year period, each of two paired Rotary districts in different parts of the world sends and receives a team that visits notable governmental, educational and cultural institutions.

The Rotary Foundation pays travel expenses, and team members are lodged in the homes of Rotarians in the host district. With the exception of the leader, team members are non-Rotarians.

Our District 779 was teamed up with District 105 from North West England for the past two years. In 1984 representatives came from England.

A small group of business people from District 311 in Northern India will be spending some time in District 779 during the months of May and June 1986. They will finish their stay in the United States at our District conference at the Balsams on June 22, 1986. In turn, District 779 will be sending a team to India in January of 1987. The people who will visit India need not be Rotarians but must be 25 to 35 years old and be willing to remain in India for a period of four to five weeks.

POLIOPLUS : QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Is there a separate fund for PolioPlus?

Yes. Anyone may contribute to the fund, Rotarians and the general public alike, as well as corporations and other foundations. Rotarians are strongly urged to develop local fund raising projects within their communities with the proceeds going to PolioPlus.

Will other funds from 3-H (Health, Hunger and Humanity) be used besides this PolioPlus fund?

Yes, for expenses of volunteer Rotarian teams of experts sent to immunization sites.

Can Rotary rid the world of polio on its own?

No. But by adding its important efforts to those of other national and international agencies Rotary can, over the next two decades, be effective in making a polio-free world a reality.

Why was the control of polio chosen as a goal?

Polio was chosen as a specific target by Rotary International because the means are available to achieve worldwide immunization coverage through the utilization of a vaccine that is simple to administer and it is also a financially realistic objective.

Polio immunization programs can serve as the initial step in the development of a more complete immunization program against other diseases; for the expansion of primary health care, and increased utilization of health programs by people who need such health care structures.

PAUL HARRIS FELLOWS: A MINI-HISTORY

Within two years after Paul Harris died in 1947, fellow Rotarians contributed \$1.3 million to The Rotary Foundation in honor of their founder. This amount was nearly twice as much as The Rotary Foundation had received over the previous thirty years. The donations provided the financial support that enabled The Rotary Foundation to grant 18 Graduate Scholarships - it's first significant International Service program.

Today, those who continue the tradition of honoring Paul Harris by contributing \$1,000 - or for whom \$1,000 is donated in their honor or memory - are designated Paul Harris Fellows. By July 1985 there were 126,492 Paul Harris Fellows with 18,983 added in 1984-85

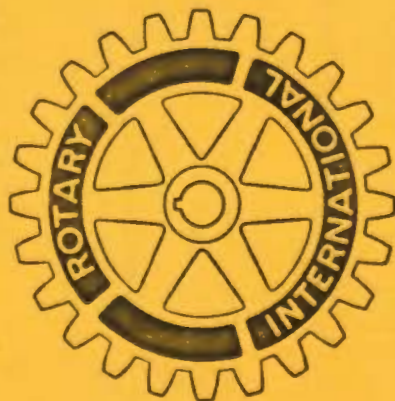

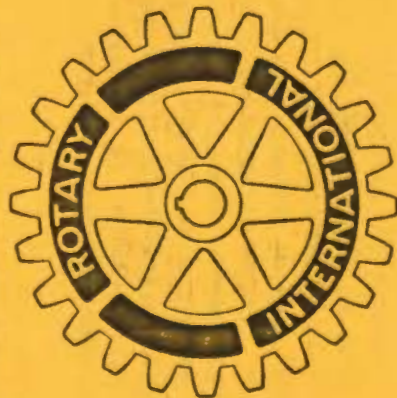
