The 4-Way Test: A Yardstick for Living

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

The test was conceived at the height of the Great Depression in 1932 by Herbert J Taylor, a Chicago Rotarian. Taylor, recently hired to save Club Aluminium from imminent bankrupcy, used the test as a basis for business decisions. As a result a climate of goodwill and trust developed between Club Aluminium and its customers and the business thrived.

The test was adopted by Rotary International January 1943.

Herbert J Taylor later became president of Rotary International during its 50th Anniversary Year (1954-1955).



Names should be submitted in writing before the next Director's meeting on May 6th with accompanying data covering the above guidelines.

The Selection Committee shall consist of the Chair of International Service, the Club President and two members of the Club (the two members will not make nominations). A 2/3rds vote by the Board of Directors present and voting shall be required for election.



Bill Stanton introduced George Rubino of Pownal Maine who with his wife Lynn Hannings operate Hannings & Rubino, a violin repair shop and bow making business. Mr Rubino has taught the Double Bass at Dartmouth College. They both play with the Portland Symphony Orchestra.

Since 1970 they have made bows for string instruments. The bows are made with a Brazilian hardwood and horse hair from China. The bows are hand made and about 25% are lost during the 10 to 15 day period it takes to craft one of the musical tools. The raw wood that goes into a bow costs about \$200 and requires seven years of drying. The finished bow can sell from \$1,000 and up. Some bows have sold for as much as \$50,000.





OPINION

A substantial number of Rotarians in this country and in others believe that the prohibition of women as members is wrong. Although they are not the majority they have a right to their opinion and a right to influence change in our organization.

One of our members has written a letter to THE ROTARIAN expressing his view on this subject as apparently many other members have done. The position of the Board of Directors of R I and the General Secretary who acts as publisher has taken the position that the magazine cannot be used to influence constitutional change.

The purpose of Rotary is create change in this world by contributing to the elimination of hunger, crippling disease, ignorance etc. by the projects that involve over a million Rotarians.

The first change that the founding fathers made to our United States Constitution was to ensure that a free and lively press existed. This freedom has served this country well over the past 210 years and is one of the main factors in making this a strong country that it is today.

Unfortunately the Board of R I has developed a policy that fails the Four Way Test and will weaken this organization in the months ahead. Reports exist that several clubs will allow women members and Rotary will need all its resources to survive the challenges to the policy of excluding women from membership. Banning free discussion about changes in the organization in the Rotarian will surely create more divisiveness. This muzzle should be removed at once.



Duane Rancourt was last week's program chairman. He introduced Ronald Thurston, Executive Vice President of the Maine Health Care Association. His association represents 121 of the 140 Maine nursing homes.

There are some startling facts about the changing patterns of the age groups of the population of the United States. The population grew $5\frac{1}{2}$ % from 1980 to 1985 with the fastest growing group being in the 80 to 85 age bracket up 21%. Age 5 to 24 is down $5\frac{1}{2}$ %, 35 to 44 up 24%, 65 to 74 up 9% and 75 to 84 up 14%. With these changes in the distribution of age groups we can expect dramatic changes in the health care area in the future. 46% of the 85+ age group are recieving care in nursing homes and changes in the financial arrangements to provide this care will be neccessary.



DISTRICT CONFERENCE


