LAST WEEK

Last week was a club assembly and the installation of the new officers and directors.

Outgoing President Bob Carson urged all of us to get involved in this 25th Anniversary year of our club. Rotary world wide now exceeds one million members and 10 new members joined our club this past year. "You should get involved and enjoy the club. You can make a difference and the more involved you get the more you will understand and appreciate the full scope of Rotary", he said.

President Bob covered some of the activities at the District Conference which in his opinion was the finest he had attended. Alan & Jim Rowe, Dick Holden, Dan Mooers were presented with Paul Harris Fellow's at the conference. Then as a surprise, Penny Carson was presented a Paul Harris Fellow by her parents Lucy and Chris Pachios. Another surprise was Jan and Paul Butler recieving Paul Harris Fellows from each other.

One of the goals that Bob set to be realized during the past year was to increase membership to 60. We gained 10 and lost 7 and finished with 55. The 90% attendance goal was exceeded in 4 of the 12 months and an annual average of 88.02% was made, coming close to the goal that was set a year ago. Another goal of adding one Paul Harris Fellow to the 7 at the beginning of the year was easily achieved and passed. 9 new Paul Harris fellows were named. In addition to the seven mentioned above President Bob himself and Governor Sam's wife, Helene, became Paul Harris Fellows.

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL CORRESPONDENCE

Dan Davidson brought the group up to date on his response from Ed Cadman outgoing R.I. President. Ed explained that the subject of women in Rotary was likely a topic for discussion at the 1989 Council of Legislation. The outgoing R.I. President also said that he felt "no useful purpose" was to be served by opening debate in the Rotary magazine, although the questions of editorial freedom in Rotary is to be discussed in September. Dan Davidson expressed frustration at the time delay concerning review of women in Rotary fearing embarassing legal and public relations developments before a decision is made.

LAST WEEK

The club heard from Charles Frizzle the Vice President of operations at Maine Yankee Nuclear Power Plant. He outlined the history of nuclear power in Maine and reviewed the economics associated with closure of Maine Yankee. The potential exists for a dramatic increase in rates for the consumer (both residential and industrial) if Maine Yankee is closed prior to its scheduled delicensing in 2008.

In response to questions, the Maine Yankee official noted that the cost of one quarter of the electricity used in Maine will double. Serious questions remain regarding the disposal of high level nuclear waste. WHAT KIND OF ROTARIAN ARE YOU?





President Caparas Visits Maine

The keynote to R.I. President M.A.T. C p ras' visit to Maine was a well-attended lob ter and clam bake reception at beautiful Sh wmut Inn in Kennebunkport on August 4.

Caparas gave a very personal and in pir tional talk about international service in underdeveloped countries. He also mentioned that R.I. will have a group study exchange this year to both Yugoslavia and Budapest.

District Governor Joe Hahn said he now has a new meaning for "PDG": it's "permanent dinner guest." Governor Joe has been hosting Mr. Caparas as he visited several club in southern Maine this past week.

On the subject of women in Rotary, Caparas said it is a very emotional issue and many members find it hard to discuss rationally. He added that, due to the Duarte case in California, we now must talk about it. The Duarte club's membership in R.I. was terminated by the Board of R.I. when it admitted women. The club lost a court case in California when it was ruled Rotary is not a business. However, in appeals court later ruled Rotary is, in fact, engaged in business and ordered the club reinstated with its women members.

As we all know, the 1986 R.I. Council on Legislation ruled once again against women. Now R.I. has until September this year to decide whether to appeal the Duarte decision. There are two options: (1) a 2/3 wote of the Council can change the by-laws but it won't meet until 1989, (2) under the law, R.I. can deem "by implication" its by-laws null and void per the California decision and therefore permit women Rotarians In California.

Caparas said, "It's not the end of the world if women are admitted." He added that a true Rotarian will still serve and help his fellow human beings even if women are members.

Our club was represented at the Shawmut Inn by Paul and Janet Butler, Bob and Penny Carson, Dan Davidson, Sam and Helene Giftos, Dick and Mary Kilroy, Dan Mooers, Dick and Mike Pyne.



President Caparas said in his recent trip to Maine that discrimination should not appear "in any form", however his official position must be to support the constitution and by-laws of the organization.



Editorial Corner

The following is the text of a letter sent to R.I. President, M.A.T. Caparas, by Dan Davidso

"First, I truly hope you had a pleasant and successful visit to Maine recently. It was a pleasure and privilege to have met you at the Shawmut Inn lobster reception and to hear your very poignant comments. I wish you every success during your year as our president.

Awhile ago, you received a copy of an extensive package of correspondence I had sent to Dr. Cadman (under my cover letter of May 28, 1986). The subject was twofold: women in Rotary, and the issue of freedom of <u>The Rotarian</u> to print discussion on subjects of interest to all of us ... such as women in Rotary.

My position on women is that we are not only wasting a valuable resource for the good of the organization, but are jeopardizing the organization as a whole by not acting now. We need to take action voluntarily, in the U.S., before we are embarrassed by being <u>forced</u> to take action (witness the Duarte case).

With regard to <u>our</u> (the membership's) magazine, I was told it will not print discussion of controversial matters per the orders of the Board. I feel strongly this is a violation of freedom of the press and it is certainly not in the best interests of the membership not to use our only vehicle as a forum for matters of concern to all Rotarians.

It seems to me it would be a worthwhile Rotary investment to commission a public opinion/attitude survey/poll to determine the extent of this perceived issue on women and the depth of feelings across the United States, one way or the other. I look on your position as similar to the CEO of a one-million member organization. It is in the best interests of all to define the issue and know all we can about this major controversial, and undoubtedly legal, public issue.

Finally, I am enclosing a recent editorial from a local newspaper here in Portland. It is likely, I feel, to be matched in cities all across our country. The problem will not go away while Rotary takes a "wait and see" attitude (see Dr. Cadman's letter to me of June 18, 1986, last paragraph); we need to be proactive.

Having heard your speech here, I am convinced your personal views are correct, humane and farsighted. I'm deeply concerned that you are bound by the rules of the international body, and bound to apply them to the more progressive countries such as the U.S. which should be moving toward changing its rules about women, unilaterally, if necessary ... and now.

Thank you for listening."

HOW TO PROPOSE A NEW MEMBER REVISED PROCEDURE 1986

Every Rotarian shares the responsibility of seeking qualified men for unfilled classifications. In this way, every club member can help his club achieve a full representation of the business and professional life of the community.

Proposal cards should be obtained from the Club Secretary, completed, and returned to the Secretary. The proposal is then referred to the Classification and Membership committees Once out of the committees, the Board of Directors will act on the proposal.

The Board's decision being favorable, the Secretary notifies the proposer that he should invite the proposed member to a regularly scheduled dinner, at which time he shall be fully informed of the privileges and responsibilities of membership in a Rotary Club and secure his permission to publish his name and classification to the membership of the club.

After permission to do so is secured, the Secretary notifies the club members by written or printed communication and if no objections are filed within ten days, the applicant, upon payment of his admission fee, is considered elected to membership.

SPECIAL NEW MEMBERSHIP INCENTIVE

The Board of Directors also voted that the Club's internal funds could cover the proposed member's initial meal. This special incentive is available to any member of the club as we make an all-out effort to boost our membership There are plenty of good candidates that only need to be given the opportunity to serve in Rotary. Let's find them.

In order to qualify, the guest must be a proposed member in accordance withe the procedure outlined above.



A District Divided...

The advantages associated with separation of the district include: size of district and span of control associated with 60+ clubs, smaller district assemblies requiring less travel and expense, and a potentially stronger "northern" voice in district governance. Following considerable discussion, the Cape Elizabeth/South Portland Rotary voted to recommend to Governor Joe the acceptance of option #4 in favor of splitting District #779.

Rotary Appeals California Court Decision


U.S. Supreme Court Justice William Rehnquist recently declined to stay a California Appeals Court ruling that R.I. must readmit the former Rotary Club of Duarte, California. That club was terminated in 1978 because it had admitted three women to membership and therefore was no longer following the agreed-upon membership rules of the Standard Rotary Club Constitution.

A trial court in California confirmed R.I.'s authority to enforce Rotary's membership rules, under which Rotary clubs have agreed to operate The Appeals Court "reversed" the decision of the trial court, saying Rotary clubs are sufficiently similar to businesses to be subject to laws of the State of California against certain types of discrimination, such as limiting membership to males.

Sometime in October, the Supreme Court of the United States will decide whether to consider a formal appeal of the decision, now in preparation. In the interim, the Appeals Court decision is expected to become effective in California.

The Garden

The way we work in our community is similar to tending a garden.
