A man becomes a Senior Active when he has served 15 years in Rotary, or has 10 years of service at age 60, or 5 years of service at age 65. The years of service do not have to be consecutive or even with the same Club.

Becoming a Senior Active member is a special achievement deserving of recognition. It demonstrates a lasting commitment to the ideals few weeks, will present a 5-minute series of members; there may be as many as six others who qualify for this distinction.

She noted that only ten percent of the available kidneys are donated and that the goal of the Kidney Foundation is to approach the other ninety percent to dramatically increase the number of participants in the program.

Wayne Clark briefed the club on the "routine inquiry law" and that means that hospital professionals are required by law to ask family members if they wish to donate the organs of a loved one upon death.

(2) holding an important position in an execu-

tive capacity with discretionary authority in any worthy and recognized business or profession; or,

(3) acting as the local agent or branch representative of any worthy and recognized business or profession having charge of such agency or branch in an executive capacity."

The provisions of Article V, Section 3, quoted above, are a limitation on the Section 1 requirements that the person be "of good character and good business or professional reputation." It is a combination of these two provisions that makes Rotary the organization that it has been and is today. It has always been and remains an organization of business owners, business executives and professionals.


