Club Action For PolioPlus:

Last year was one of organization, recruitment, and coordination, as well as fund raising for the PolioPlus campaign. It ended on in June, 1987 with an impressive \$30 million raised through major gifts and other sources.

This Rotary year now in its 7th month, is a most important one for the campaign. It is a time for action when all Rotary clubs are being asked to concentrate on intensive promotion and fund raising, and to gather the remaining \$86 million dollars in contributions and pledges.

President Keller hopes to announce the successful conclusion of the \$120 million Campaign at the 1988 Convention in May. Here's an update on how the money is being spent: The Rotary Foundation Trustees have recently approved grants to 12 PolioPlus countries. The 12 countries are: Togo, Burkina Faso, Dominican Republic, Guinea-Bissau, Lesotho, Swaziland, Zimbabwe, Lesotho, Cameroon, Guinea, Madagascar, Rwanda, and Zaire.

India alone accounts for nearly half of all the world's polio cases each year and this grant added to a previous one of \$2.6 million represents a major mile-stone in polio immunization.

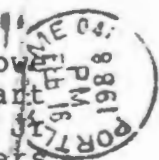

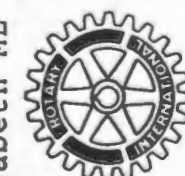

LAST WEEK

The Reverend Thomas Merrill of the Thornton Height's Methodist Church was last week's guest speaker. The Reverend Merrill had returned only a few hours earlier from a visit to the Holy Land. He was critical of the Jewish Government's treatment of the Arab residents and the displacement from the land that many Arabs had lived on for literally hundreds of years to make way for new settlers to the area.

Although there is conflict going on in this area of the world the Reverend Merrill thinks that it is exaggerated by the press. Their group did not see any problems in the old part of Jerusalem on a day that the press reported rioting.

Security precautions required a three hour delay to get into Israel and as the group left by the Allenby Bridge to fly back from Jordan to the USA they were delayed for three and a half hours. Reverend Merrill characterized this delay as harrassment because they were using the Jordanian airline for the trip home.

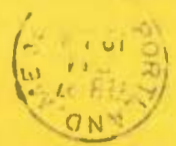
