



Greater Portland Rape Center, Inc.

This past week the membership had an opportunity to hear Merril Cousins, Associate Director of the Greater Portland Rape Crisis Center, discuss one of the nation's growing social problems - sexual assault and abuse.

The Rape Crisis Center is a volunteer organization serving Cumberland and York Counties. It is funded through a a combination of private and public funds with a paid staff of two. Its goal's are three-fold - to assist the victims and their families, to reduce the incidence of sexual assault and to educate the community.

The incidence of sexual abuse and assault in our nation (and state) is staggering. Statistics indicate that 1 in 7 persons (male, female, child or adult) will be sexually assaulted or abused in their lifetime. The incidence of abuse and assault on woman is even more startling - 1 in 3.

When an assault does occur the Rape Crisis Center helps by providing physical protection, medical care, reassurance, and emotional support. They operate a 24 hour hotline that is maintain by volunteers 365 days a year. Last year they received over 1000 calls - an increase of 30% or the previous year.

This covers the salary of one full-time minister, a full-time secretary and the cost of broadcasting 52 Sunday Television programs and over 300 morning radio broadcasts. (broadcast time is donated by the local radio and television stations).

What is meant by Club Service?

"Club Service" involves actions a
Rotarian takes to help his club
function successfully. For example, being present at its meetings, taking
part in its fellowship, taking part in
its programs, serving on committees and
on the board, paying dues, and representing the club in activities outside
the club, such as speaking at other
Rotary Clubs; attending intercity meetings, district assemblies, conferences
and leadership forums; and in organizing new Rotary Clubs.

Who is in charge of Club Service?

The Club president appoints one member of his board of directors to be chairman for Club Service activities.

What committees are engaged in Club Service Activities?

Classifications, membership, membership development, program, fellowship activities, Rotary Information, public relations, attendance, club bulletin, magazine, and any other committees that may be appointed on particular phases of Club Service to carry out the programs of Rotary.

What is a club assembly?

A meeting of the officers, directors, and committee chairmen of a club to coordinate and develop the program of Rotary within the Club.

What is a club forum?

A formal meeting of the entire membership to inform members about service activities.


