

The Program

In a true spirit of Rotary, Dan (Democrat) Mooers, introduced Jasper (Jack) Wyman, Republican candidate for the United States Senate.

Jack Wyman provided the club with a spirited presentation of where he stands on a number of issues. He feels that our dominance is being challenged in the world but that we can continue our greatness. To do this we can not hide behind economic protectionism, but must insist on reciprocity and must have political courage - no specifics given. Mr. Wyman favors a balanced budget and to give the president a line item veto. He also would support a federal budget freeze tied only to increases for inflation. Some of the programs supported by Wyman are: Headstart, earned income tax credit, full deductibility of IRA's and tax breaks on savings.

The Program

Dan Moores introduced the Honorable Alexander McNichol, a Justice of the Maine Superior Court for Cumberland and York Counties. Judge McNichols career has many noteworthy achievements; pioneer work in providing legal services to the poor through Pine Tree Legal Assistance, 1st Asst District Attorney for Cumberland County, Judge at large in the Maine District Court and 18 years in private practice.

His Honor noted the controversy surrounding the sentencing of felons, particularly alternatives to incarceration. Most prisons in the USA are overcrowded (including the Maine State Prison in Thomaston). It costs approximately \$1200 per month to house a federal prisoner and the system is on the point of collapse. He suggested that society determine the goals of its penal and develop programs that can meet them.



Last Week's Program: At the November 9th meeting Mike McGovern introduced David W. Pickering, the Chief of Police of the town of Cape Elizabeth since 1978. Chief Pickering talked about the changes which have taken place in the hiring process for new police officers since he joined the Department in 1973. He explained that officers are now expected to do more than simply "enforce the law", and therefore need to be clearly qualified to work "for the community". The hiring process now consumes up to 14 weeks and includes tests and interviews to determine intelligence, aptitude, and psychological fitness.


