1. Have a Rotary Information Officer: Jim Rowe is ours.
2. Enlist new Paul Harris Fellows.
3. Produce monthly attendance reports.
4. Increase membership by 5%: we need two more new members.
5. Conduct at least two Club Assemblies per year.
6. Support the Dominican Republic Community Service project: we sent \$800 for fresh water wells.
7. Conduct an attendance contest with another club: Jackie Critchley is chairing that committee.
8. Have at least six members visit together two clubs more than 100 miles away.
9. Establish a fund to pay for the Club President to attend the District Conference: we do this.

10. Publish weekly bulletins: we do this.

He mentioned that 10% of our dollars goes to the Rotary Foundation for international programs. Dan Mooers discussed the Governor's Challenge to visit two clubs over 100 miles away. During the week beginning February 6th, we will visit a breakfast and a dinner meeting, one club within our District and one outside of it. The clubs will be notified in advance of our visits.

The Program

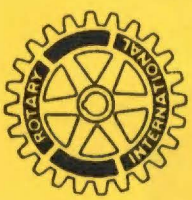

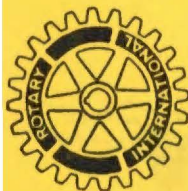

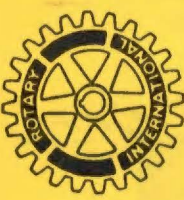
