Speaker :

We were joined by our speaker for the evening Reverend Fred Lipp of the 1st Parish Unitarian Universalist Church of Portland. Reverend Lipp was born in Massachusetts, attended the College of Wooster in Ohio, and attended Chicago University School of Divinity. He has a son who is a sophomore at the University of Southern Maine Law School and a daughter who is a sophomore at Bowdoin.

Reverend Lipp was one of a group of people who visited Portland's city sister in the Soviet Union "Archangel". Archangel has been city closed to western foreigners for 45 years. It is a city of 400,000 located 400 miles north of Moscow on the White Sea. It is a seaport city with a long history of fishing and nautical events. Reverend Lipp wanted to represent Maine and the United States well. He chose as his gift to the Soviet people a book called Rumphous, written by a Maine author. His most memorable story was the attending of church with the chief of police. This was

before the actual reforms of recent months and the first time the police chief had ever attended church (seeing as how he was a good party member). The service was a bit over 2 hours long most of which was standing up. Finally Reverend Lipp spoke to the congregation and presented the archbishop with his final copy of Rumphous.

In June 40 professionals from Archangel will be coming to Portland and the following summer a delegation from Portland will be going to Archangel again.
