October is Vocational Service Month. Thanks go to Dan Davidson for lining up our guest speakers for the entire month to talk about vocational service. Our first speaker:

Wayne Ross - Director SMVTI

Wayner informed us that SMVTI is a two year technical college offering programs for Associates degrees as well as one year certificates. There are 32 different programs available. SMVTI also works closely with local businesses to develop and customize programs to fit the company's need.

SMVTI is the oldest vocational college in Maine. It was established in 1946 as Maine Vocational Technical Institute, a center for training returning Vets. Their Number one priority is economic development. They are continually making people aware of what they have to offer thru various programs such as campus tours.

Wayne also said the school is in an expansion mode. They are currently working on restoring a condemned building located on campus to house an on-site working lab. This lab would be designed as a training center for their hotel/motel and restaurant programs to acquire "on-the-job" training. Other programs would be worked into this training center. To help with the cost of this project, the bond issue (ques. #5) for \$20 million to vocational schools would include \$4.2 million to SMVTI for this and other building restoration.

More information from Dan Davidson about the Resource list you received last week:

Vocational Service: A major "All Hands" project. Our Vocational Service Committee, at the request of the two High Schools we serve, is putting together a vocational resource list. The list will enable school counselors to offer students a list of numerous vocations and individuals in those vocations who are willing to be called by students to talk about careers, opportunities, how to prepare, etc. We have a goal of no less than 400 listings.

Each Rotarian should list themselves on the forms provided PLUS ten (10) colleagues/associates who would be willing to offer just a few minutes of their time to students interested in their professions. We all work with many people and it should only take a few minutes of your time to ask friends to help us by allowing their names to be listed on our resource list. We will computerize the list and give it to the schools alphabetically by career field. And we plan to update and expand it each year.

Get as many volunteers as you can; let's give the high schools an excellent reference list!! See Dan or Don Day if you have any questions or need additional forms.

In writing this letter I am in hope of generating a little more enthusiasm and sense of commitment to the club's fund-raising efforts. As you are aware our club does not assess members to cover the costs of programs and causes we choose to support. All of our funds must be raised through the various projects we undertake during the year such as theater night, Christmas tree sales, fried dough sales, and any other opportunity that arises.

The participation in Theater Night this year was very disappointing. Tim Thompson and others put a great deal of effort into this event and had every reason to believe that we were on target for ticket sales. During the twenty-four hours immediately preceding the performance we had 122 tickets turned in unsold. Had we known earlier that people were not going to be selling the tickets we could have used another marketing strategy. As it is we lost over \$1,400 in potential profit and will be unable to help many of the programs we had hoped to do.

Qualifications to become a Rotarian....  
Who can your propose????

An adult male/female person of good character and good business or professional reputation, and

(1) engaged as proprietor, partner, corporate officer, or manager of any worthy and recognized business or profession;

or

(2) holding an important position in an executive capacity with discretionary authority in any worthy and recognized business or profession;

or

(3) acting as the local agent or branch representative of any worthy and recognized business or profession having charge of such agency or branch in an executive capacity;

and

personally and actively engaged in the respective business or professions in which they are classified in the club and having their place of business or residence located within the territorial limits of the club or within the corporate limits of the city in which the club is located or within the territorial limits of an immediately adjoining club.

(b) There shall be not more than one active member in each classification of business or profession, excepting the religion, news media, and diplomatic service classifications, and excepting the provision for additional active members as provided in the By-laws.

(c) The By-laws of Rotary International may provide for kinds of membership in addition to active membership in Rotary clubs to be designated as senior active, past service, and honorary membership and shall prescribe the qualifications for each.

I hope this helps those of you who are unsure who to propose. I also have available a list of the open classifications available within our club. Just give me a holler!!

Next week's speaker is Barry Valentine, who will talk on general aviation.

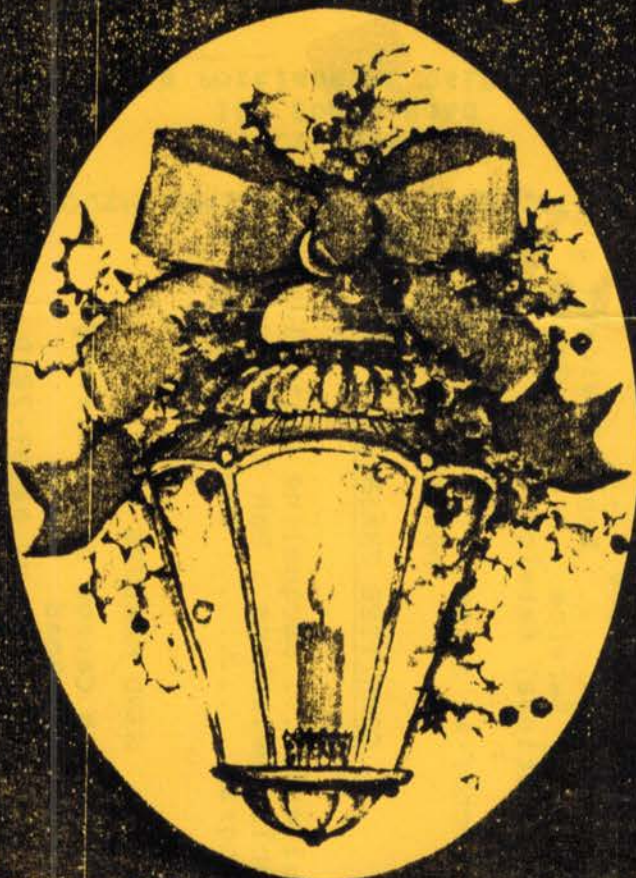
