At the turn of the century, Maine was the largest in the country, we're now second. The industry is critical to Maine's economy.

The paper industry is a heavily regulated one. There are continuous environmental issues. Studies are costly; a study just completed took 8 months and cost \$1.5 million to \$2 million. Even with these cost factors, the paper industry strives to continue to work with the State on all environmental issues.

After Solidarity,
The Rotary Club
Was Sure to Follow

Warsaw Has Its First Club
After a 50-Year Hiatus;
Greetings From Omaha

WARSAW — "If you don't have free enterprise, you can't have Rotary," Ken Mall likes to say. Now Poland has both, and that gives Mr. Mall an opportunity to stand up and say a few words.

Tim Ken Mall from the Bethel-St. Clair club in Pittsburgh, I bring greetings to the new wave of Rotary in Warsaw. Bethel-St. Clair was chosen in 1977 as the model of model clubs. In two months we raised \$125,000 for Polio Plus. It's been an exciting experience. It's very encouraging to see so many people.

He sits down to applause. Two West Germans across the table offer greetings from their clubs. Warren Hill from Omaha, Neb., then presents his club flag, and a Roman Catholic priest of Polish roots from Daytona, Fla., says: "When I read in my Rotary paper that for the first time in 50 years Rotary was back in Poland, I called Evanston to find out where this club was. I'm happy to be here. We wish you had 100 or more clubs in Poland."

Dress Code

The Warsaw Rotary Club meets at 7 p.m. every Wednesday around a long, dark-jetty table in the dining room of the doctors' club, its walls hung with old portraits of Polish noblemen looking glassy-eyed under powdered wigs. The meeting always starts with the introduction of guests, then a light dinner, guest speaker and discussion. A half-dozen serious-suited guests from the West usually turn up. Some Polish members—25 have joined so far—don't put on a tie, but these are the early days of capitalist reintegration.

At world Rotary headquarters in Evanston, Ill., the Warsaw club has caused much excitement during this time of change in the East. The Rotary motto, "Service Above Self," has spread to 167 nations and 24,614 clubs in such cities as Hyderabad, India, and Potsdam, N.Y. Until this year, women and Communist Party members didn't tend to get in. But today, Rotary will look at any professional person or anyone who runs or owns something.

"Friendship and help," says Barry Poland, here on business from the club in Harrgate, England. He sips red wine. "It sure helps to get acquainted," says Mr. Hill of Omaha, trying a spoonful of Polish stew.

Regemust Piotek turns to Mr. Poland and hands him a business card. "I am president of a consulting firm with long experience," Mr. Piotek says. "Now we are setting up joint ventures. We offer our clients full coverage." Mr. Piotek, it develops, also belongs to the Communist Party. "Oh, in Poland it means nothing. Rotary is nonpolitical—a strong virtue. Better contacts."

Hiatus in China

In Communist China, unfortunately, Rotary's extension program is on standby, peeding freedom. However, the Eugene, Ore., Rotary knows of 20 community leaders in its sister city, Irkutsk, Siberia, U.S.S.R., who are hot to get a club going there. And now Rotary has full affiliates in Budapest and Warsaw.

As the waitress quietly serves coffee, a club officer at the head table rises, and switches temporarily into Polish for the announcements.

"These big buttons," he says. The Polish members all wear big plastic buttons with their names on them. "We had 25 buttons. Please Turn to Page A8, Column 4

took. Now six buttons are gone. Please return them!" The members look ashamed. "We want everybody to have a button."

The foreign guests can't understand, except for Michael Pawelek, a courtly man of Polish origin who proposes a transfer of technology. "I am a member of Rotary Club No. 1 in Chicago," he says. "We have buttons, similar to these, made of paper. You fill one out and stick it on your suit. If you don't have them, I can offer you some." He sits, to applause and looks of relief.

Warsaw had a Rotary Club in the 1830s. "Evanston didn't hear much from it after 1945, when Jerry Loth, who served as a director of Rotary International from 1938 to 1940, sent this letter."

"I am pleased to state that the Rotary spirit has prevailed among us during the whole war, and although Rotary was persecuted, we kept together faithfully, maintained friendly relations, and helped those who were in need. I can only tell you that we went through hell." Rotary, he added, was "looking forward to better times."

Better times have arrived at last, with the assistance of Marek Sredniawa, who is standing now to give the guests some background. "It took two months for us to register because of more pressing matters, such as the registration of Solidarity," he explains. Mr. Sredniawa, 46, is a telephone software expert. He has on a blue blazer with the sleeves rolled up, and a red tie. "I want to underline the devotion of the people who began this movement."

Especially Marek," someone says. Everyone applauds.

In 1964, Mr. Sredniawa got on a train in Krakow and sat opposite Rotarian Jack C. Olsson of Canberra, Australia. They talked. Mr. Olsson asked if Mr. Sredniawa would like an all-expense-paid trip down under, sponsored by Canberra Rotary. Mr. Sredniawa went home and looked up Rotary in his encyclopedia. It wasn't listed. But Mr. Sredniawa took Mr. Olsson up on his offer, and at the Australian Rotary Club, he was impressed by "the friendly attitude toward people."

He knew Rotary belonged in Poland. There wasn't much hope, but Mr. Olsson wouldn't say die. In 1968, he induced Rotary's president, an Australian that year, to pay Poland a visit. Mr. Sredniawa, who didn't have many connections, still managed to set up some meetings, plus a special tour of the Royal Castle. He was surprised. Nobody turned Rotary down. From then on, it was easy. Communism collapsed, and he booked the doctors' club for 7 p.m. on Wednesdays.

Mr. Sredniawa taps his glass. It is time for the guest speaker, who comes from Poland's first private school since the war, and who gives the details in a short talk. After questions, Adam Stankiewicz tells about an idea he has for the Rotary Club's most important mission: voluntary service.

"In our club," he says, "we have a specialist in horse riding for paralyzed children. It is called hippotherapy. And I am the owner of a country club with 10 horses. I suggest that Rotary buy two horses, and employ a special teacher for hippotherapy."

To murmurs of approval, the meeting dissolves. Polish members file out, making sure to deposit their buttons at the desk. Mr. Hill gets his attendance card signed; he hasn't missed Rotary in eight years. In the foyer, Ken Mall corners Mr. Sredniawa.

"I have an idea that I can change the world here," says Mr. Mall. "Stamp out communism." An investor, Mr. Mall is searching for Poles who want to start in

New England is currently in a recession. From 1963-1968 (the fat years) New England was experiencing a 50% growth rate. This was faster than the nation at large. This has now stopped and has even been considered to be negative growth at this point. Although New England was felt to have a fairly diversified economy and be somewhat resistant to recession, we have seen four of our leading industries slow concurrently (computers, defense, real estate, and construction). These industries represent 25% of the workforce in New England and the impact has created a cyclical pattern of layoff, decreased buying power, decreased production, and so on... The trend should be able to reverse itself at some point, but identifying the bottom is difficult for analysts because of the phenomenal growth from 83' - 88'. This was an excellent program and kept us very interested.

officials. This sometimes makes things difficult because no one is accountable to anyone else. (Too many chiefs and not enough indians?) County government is made up of 5 departments and has been in existence since 1760 with few changes. It is currently under fire as to whether it needs to exist or not.

County government satisfies some needs that town and state governments cannot. Examples are some centralized services which would be cost prohibitive for each town to maintain (i.e. toxic spill cleanup, land use planning, jail facilities, etc.) The recent Vision 2000 group to look at life in the 21st century in the greater Portland area has four specific things it will look at surrounding regional government. 1) geographic boundaries of the counties; 2) funding mechanism for regional government (currently the property tax); 3) the necessity for regional government; 4) defining a regional government mission.

Joe Mazzotti gave us a clearer picture of the role, value and awareness of county government and officials.
