## ROTARY'S TOTAL PRODUCT CONCEPT

The guest speaker, Bill O'Brien, an employment consultant with Elliot Berv Associates, spoke about the "Total Product Concept". There were four parts of the model. The **General Product**; the **Expected Product**; the **Expanded Product**; and the **Potential Product**.

I realized that the model could be utilized to represent any product line **OR** even as a representation of a service organization such as **ROTARY**.

Although Mr. O'Brien didn't have his usual time... minimum 45 minutes up to three days... what he presented during his 20 minutes might be of more of a benefit than anyone realized!

The "general product" of ROTARY is a service organization. Its "expected product" would be (and is) a club providing a network of professionals; meeting on a regular basis; outside of the sometime rigid, fast-paced and stressful work environment; and dedicated to provide the local community with much needed services and funds by the efforts of its members via various "fun" activities...

### Example: Expected Product...

- a. **Michael K. McGovern** gave the invocation;
- b. Michael also introduced visitors:
  - 1. Clayton Barry from Biddeford; Ina from Kansas; and Bob Doe (SPCE) visiting from Hawaii; and Tom Riley.
- c. **Sam Giftos** led the club in a rousing rendition of: "Sing! Everyone sing!" and "R-O-T-A-R-Y"
- d. Raffle was conducted by **Tom Hennessy**. **Bill Kourakos** provided an oil painting by Sophie... and Mike McGovern's 5th raffle ticket was the winner!

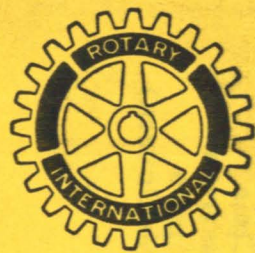

The Group Study Exchange (GSE), introduced as a program of Our Rotary Foundation in 1965, developed rapidly as an avenue of improving international understanding. It has provided opportunities for thousands of young business and professional men and women, all non-Rotarians, to experience intensive study and exposure to a nation and culture different from their own. There are approximately 400 exchanges awarded by the Foundation each year.

The GSE program provides grant for teams of 25- to 35-year-old outstanding non-Rotarian business and professional persons to travel between paired Rotary districts in different countries. Teams spend four to six weeks aboard, where they study their host country's institutions, economy and lifestyles; observe their own occupations and professions in that country; develop friendships and discuss ideas with community leaders.

District 7780 has been paired this Rotary year with a district in Brazil. The team will be led by a Rotarian leader who must be fluent in Portuguese and will have either a four or five members non-Rotarian team. 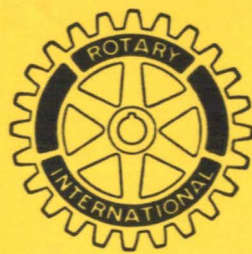

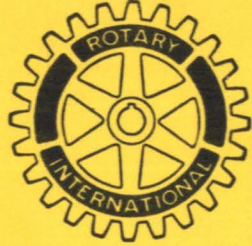

## Robert Skoglund

Ancestral stories of  
St. George, Maine.

IN A NATIONALLY SYNDICATED humor column and as a professional master of ceremonies and after-dinner talker, he re-creates the stories of his neighbors and relatives in tiny St. George, Maine, where his ancestral ties go back 200 years. Last fall he wrote a TV commercial for the Maine Seat Belt Coalition. It showed a friend, Stanley French, beside a car in his South Thomaston junkyard. The windshield was broken because a passenger had been thrown out through it. Tears stream down Stanley's face. Skoglund narrates: "Nothing bothers Stanley more than seeing a car brought in here with the windshield pushed out because one of his friends wasn't wearing a seat belt. ## Our Rotary Foundation

1917-1992  
75 years of Service

Rotarians the world over readily recognize and identify the name of Paul P. Harris as the founder of Rotary International. Less well known, even to Rotarians, is the name of Arch C. Klumph. He, too, was an early president of Rotary International, the sixth, serving in 1916-17, and it was he who proposed to the 1917 convention in Atlanta, Georgia, U.S.A., the creation of an "endowment fund for Rotary ... for the purpose of doing good in the world in charitable, educational, and other avenues of community progress."

The proposal was successful, and the fund became a reality with receipt of its first contribution - \$26.50 from the Rotary Club of Kansas City, Missouri, U.S.A. The gift represented the surplus of funds left over from the 1918 convention in that city.

By 1928 the charitable fund that started at the 1918 Rotary International Convention had grown to \$5,739.07, and the R.I. Convention in Minneapolis, Minnesota, U.S.A., decided it was time to give the fund legal recognition. It was renamed The Rotary Foundation and five Trustees were named to "hold, invest, manage, and administer" all of its property and, with approval of the R.I. Board of Directors, to "expend the corpus of the income herefrom, as a single trust, for the furtherance of the purposes of R.I." The first trustees included Arch Klumph who served as chairman for the next five years. The first grant was made in 1930 - \$500.00 to the International Society of Crippled Children.

## LOOK BEYOND YOURSELF

The key word in community service is "involvement." This is the foundation on which any community service program can successfully be built. We have heard, as you will, that nonavailability of funds limits the activity in community service. Almost always in such cases, the limitation is more severe for involvement than funds. Great ideas of the world have been killed not for want of money but for want of efforts. Service, as distinct from charity, means much more than simply contributing money. Caring means much more than the impersonal gesture of writing a check; and the human touch of compassion means much more than the golden touch of Midas.

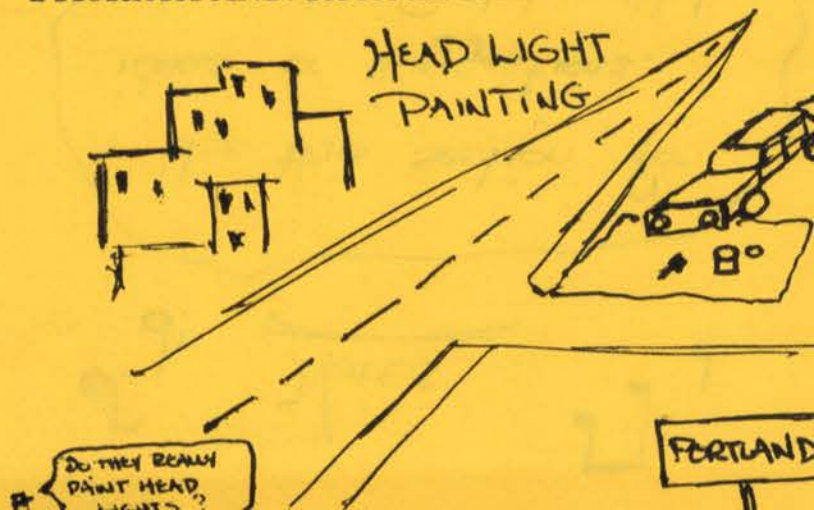

# Our Rotary Foundation

1917-1992  
75 years of Service

An even more significant Rotary Foundation program was to begin in the spring of 1947. The R.I. Directors and Foundation Trustees agreed to use some of the Paul Harris Memorial Fund contributions to fund a program that had long been dreamed of - international graduate scholarships to enhance world understanding and peace. In 1948, a group of 18 well qualified scholars from seven countries became the first Rotary Foundation Fellows for Advanced Study. Fortunately, the father of The Rotary Foundation had lived to see his creation finally take wing. Arch Klumph died in his home city of Cleveland, Ohio, U.S.A., in 1951.

Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarships provide funding and round trip airfare for various study programs conducted outside scholars' home countries. The program's primary purpose has always been the promotion of international understanding. Since 1947, scholar ambassadors have furthered that goal and have pursued studies in a steadily widening range of subjects, including vocational studies, journalism, teaching of the handicapped, and many other areas of specialty at both the graduate and undergraduate levels. Two special world competitive scholarships are intended for intensive Japanese studies and the completion of master's degrees in agriculture for candidates from developing countries.

According to Detective Jack Nichols, Cape Elizabeth is a great place to be a thief! However; he is personally committed to making it a rotten place...to be a thief.

Nichols worked in New York prior to locating to Cape in 1989. He is probably best known for his work on the "gypsy" arrests earlier this year. Much of his success he credits to the excellent work of the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office.

He went on to cite some local crimes and then made several recommendations to make Cape Elizabeth (or any Town) thief "unfriendly".

Detective Nichols was accompanied by Art Ream, a dispatcher with the Cape Elizabeth Police Department. Both men stressed the importance of good communications with the local police. They said to expect and demand high standards from the police; to report any activities even remotely suspicious; and to be completely satisfied in the manner in which your call and/or complaint is handled.

The two officers completed their presentation by acknowledging the unique situation of Cape residents. Due to the small size of the community and the relatively low crime rate; the residents receive more personalized services than residents of other communities. Among the most visible: Business Watch and House Watch. Each of these services guarantees that your home and office will be physically checked on a regular basis.

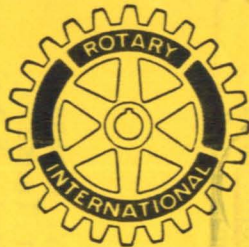
