Dear President Levasseur,

D.C. Dick Clark has given me permission to contact Rotary Clubs in Area IV and V with regard to a project that Saco Bay has undertaken.

Last September, Saco Bay voted to contact a Rotary Club in Iowa and find out if our club could provide items to help with the rebuilding of the devastated areas. After much communication back and forth, it was decided that if our club could fill a tractor trailer truck with building materials, this would be the greatest help to them.

Once the decision was made as to the best way to help, we had to find a tractor trailer rig. After many inquiries, and with assistance from the Mt. Pleasant Iowa Rotarians, the Wal-Mart Corporation contacted me on March 24th and said they would donate the vehicle and driver to deliver the materials to Mt. Pleasant, Iowa.

Our request to your club is threafold. First, if anyone in your club would have access to building materials (lumber, sheet rock, insulation, electrical, plumbing, etc.) that could be donated for the trip to Iowa, it would be greatly appreciated.

Second, if your club feels this is a worthwhile venture, and does not have access to building materials but would like to contribute, we can take monetary contributions and buy materials at a reduced rate.

Finally, we need people to help loan the truck on the two days it will be here. The truck will be set up in the Scarboro Wal-Mart parking lot on Friday, April 15th and Saturday, April 16th. We will be accepting donations from 11:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. on Friday and 10:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. on Saturday. If any member wishes to help, please inform them of these times. We will provide refresiments for the volunteers.



Maine Rotarian and wife leave nearly \$2 million to Rotary Foundation

Nearly 24 years after his death, a Maine Rotarian's close relationship with Rotary lives on. Ned Cutting, who died in 1970 at the age of 67, was an active member of the Rotary Club of Rockland, Maine. His wife, Grace, also was involved with Rotary, and after her husband died she continued her enthusiastic support of Rotary projects. With Grace's death at 89 in March 1993, The Rotary Foundation became the recipient of nearly \$2 million, including a bequest from Grace and a charitable remainder trust left by her husband.

The Foundation recently received the third installment of the Cuttings' gift. The entire gift will be used, as the donors directed, "for the purposes of said Foundation, including scholarships for the exchange of students on an international basis." The couple had no children, but scholarship programs were a high priority for them, both graduates of the University of Maine. Memorial contributions in Grace's name went toward the Rockland club's own scholarship fund.

"What impressed me most about this gift," said RI Director-elect Daniel Mooers, "is Grace's vivid memory of her husband's experience in the Rotary Club of Rockland. Her strong impressions so many years later of his involvement with Rotary in the community speak very highly of the club." Mooers is a member of the Rotary Club of South Portland-Cape Elizabeth in neighboring District 7780.

Ned Cutting was a pioneer in Christmas tree cultivation, and he and his wife jointly operated one of Maine's leading blueberry production and wholesaling businesses.

"When I learned of the Cuttings' gift," said Mooers, "I thought of the old adage, 'What goes around comes around.' Our club used to buy Christmas trees from the Cutting farm for an annual fund-raiser," he explained. "Now some of those profits have come back to benefit The Rotary Foundation. It's simply amazing."



After dejeuner we were escorted, with the help of lanterns and flashlights, through a pitch noir tunnel into the fort. The teens shrieked as they squished through the mud or reached out to touch a slimy wall. It was great fun and a bon temps was had by all. The rest of their weekend in Maine was filled with attending ecole with their American hosts on Friday, going to the mall, a potluck dinner, and participating in the host family's activities. The agenda was similar when our students went up to Quebec for a weekend in March. In place of the boat trip here, the

Canadian Rotarians took our students to a maple-sugaring farm.

On the surface, the purpose of the exchange is for each group of students to get to practice speaking the language of the other country. However one of the local teachers observed that the students benefitted even more from the exposure to another culture. For instance, she found the Canadian students to have a more relaxed attitude to life and they didn't seem to worry so much about the small stuff as her own students did. Congratulations to Mike McGovern for 6 years of perfect attendance and Warren Simpson for 32 years!


