SOUP KITCHEN CUPCAKES

You let women into Rotary and then one thing leads to another and before you know it there are **recipes** in the **bulletin!** For **Joe Conroy**, here is the recipe for the cupcakes I brought to the last soup kitchen:

- 1 pkg. 2-layer yellow cake mix
- 8 oz. cream cheese
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 6 oz. chocolate chips

Mix cake according to directions. Fill cupcake papers about 2/3 full. Cream sugar together with cream cheese; beat in egg. Stir in chocolate chips. Drop a spoonful on top of each cupcake. Bake about 20 minutes at 350 degrees. I store them in the refrigerator and either eat them cold or zap them in the microwave a few seconds so the chocolate melts.

GUEST SPEAKER

Speaking of **Kathy**, **Bob Lindsey** introduced his wife **Kathy**, an eight year veteran of **Glaxo Pharmaceutical Company**. She spoke very ably, and informatively about the role of Pharmaceutical companies in our lives. There has been a lot of Press about Pharmaceutical profits, especially during the **Health Care Reform Campaign**. As **Kathy** pointed out, it takes an average of **\$231 MM** to bring a single prescription drug to market. Patent protection lasts from **8** to **10** years before Generic companies reduce the cost. Therefore, there is a small window of time to recoup the investment.

Kathy pointed out several key areas such as heart conditions and cancer, where drugs save many dollars in medical costs, and improve the patients overall condition. The program was well received by the **Club**, and we thank **Kathy** and **Bob** for an excellent program.

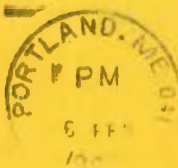

"Doing The Right Thing"

Tonight's speaker was Kevin Gildart of Bath Iron Works. The topic of his talk was ethics in business. The Cape Elizabeth native spoke to us in his capacity as Vice President of the Ethics Officers Association based at Bentley College. As Kevin noted, ethics originated from the greek work "ethos." This concept was how the greeks viewed themselves from an inner perspective. Today, that view has evolved into how people see themselves interacting with other people. In essence, what Kevin said was that ethical problems occur today because people have difficulty coping in the workplace with the rapidly changing standards. Ethics cannot be imposed but must be respected.

Given the topic of tonight's speech, I thought it appropriate to remind the members of the code of conduct that we follow as rotarians:

The Four Way Test: (1) Is it the truth? (2) Is it fair to all concerned? (3) Will it build goodwill and better friendships? (4) Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

Truly words to live by. Thank you to Dieter Schnauck for inviting Kevi to speak.

CAESAR SALAD

Ingredients:

- 1 large clove garlic. Crush against side of wooden or glass salad bowl. Coat wall of bowl thoroughly until clove is virtually disintegrated. Some recipes call for this being done the night before and refrigerating, covered.
- 6 tablespoons olive oil
- 3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 3 tablespoons vinegar
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon powdered mustard
- 5-6 drops Worcestershire Sauce
- 2 heads Romaine, washed, picked over carefully, and shredded to bite size
- 1 egg (Poke needle hole in large end, drop in boiling water for exactly one minute. Beat lightly with a fork) We use 3/4 of a package of Eggbeaters™ instead.
- 5 or 6 anchovies, chopped fine.
- CROUTONS
- Fresh ground pepper
- 1/2 cup or more grated Parmesan

Preparation:

Combine Olive oil, lemon juice, salt, powdered mustard, Worcestershire and vinegar and stir to mix thoroughly. Place lettuce in bowl. Add vinegar mixture and toss thoroughly. Add egg and toss again thoroughly. Add parmesan in stages and toss until well coated. Occasionally during this process, add some fresh ground pepper to taste and toss. Add anchovies and toss lightly to distribute. Serve and top with croutons and one last little dusting of parmesan.

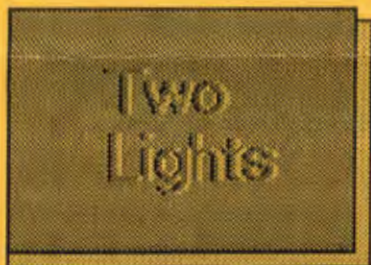

SOUTH PORTLAND CHIEF OF POLICE ED GOOGINS

Chief Googins has been involved in police work since 1971. Prior to coming to So. Portland, he was a Captain in the Portland Police Dept.

"It's different from the old days of having 'beat officers,'" he says. "Now police are asked to work with, and help solve, community problems. We can make a difference in our communities."

He brought with him a book *Recognizing & Combatting Crimes Against Business* which covers such subjects as shoplifting, robbery, employee theft, check & credit fraud, and substance abuse -- and how to work to avoid these problems. The books are available at no charge.

With Ed was Lt. Linda Barker, DARE officer, who told us youth gangs join to get affection, recognition and a sense of belonging. The "DARE Alternative Program provides fun activities for youth that foster positive relationships with police and teachers. Examples are rafting, mountain biking, etc. "It helps them resist negative pressures," she says.

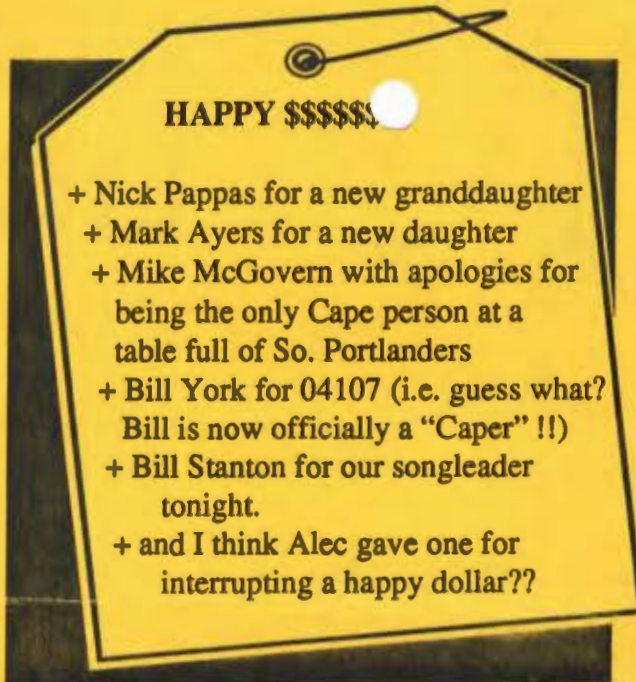

"In a small office on Dearborn Street in downtown Chicago, four businessmen gathered on 23 February, 1905, to start the first Rotary club -- Sylvester Schiele (coal dealer), Paul Harris (lawyer), Hiram Shorey (tailor), and Gus Loehr (mining engineer)."

"As its first community project, the Chicago Rotary Club led a campaign to install comfort stations in City Hall. The project was unpretentious, but it set a lasting precedent for civic service." (Editor's note: don't read ANYTHING into this!)



ADDITIONAL PROGRAM NOTES:

CRAIG TRIBUNO ALPHA ONE

Craig Tribuno was introduced by Agnes Winship (who somehow also got stuck with the song tonight??). Craig is Treasurer of the Alpha One organization, a non-profit vendor of services for the disabled. It was founded 15 years ago by Steve Tremblay and today is one of the largest such companies in the nation.

Alpha One has offices in Presque Isle, Brewer, Augusta, and South Portland which employ some 600 people and which move about \$7 million through the organization each year.

Most of those employed are themselves disabled.

The company provides "consumer-directed" services such as personal home care, architectural help, driver evaluations, etc.

Of particular note, says Craig, is its adaptive equipment loan program which loans money for use in obtaining anything from vans to bikes to hearing aids. It is the largest such program in the nation, he says, and began with a \$5 million bond which today is self-sustaining. The loans have criteria and require repayment.

Alpha One has also spun off a for-profit subsidiary known as Wheelchairs Unlimited which is now five years old.

And Craig spoke with special pride of their "Open Waters" program which matches disabled persons, peers and instructors for Scuba diving! Craig says the program has been extremely successful, receiving thousands of requests already as well as the interests of the scuba diving equipment industry.

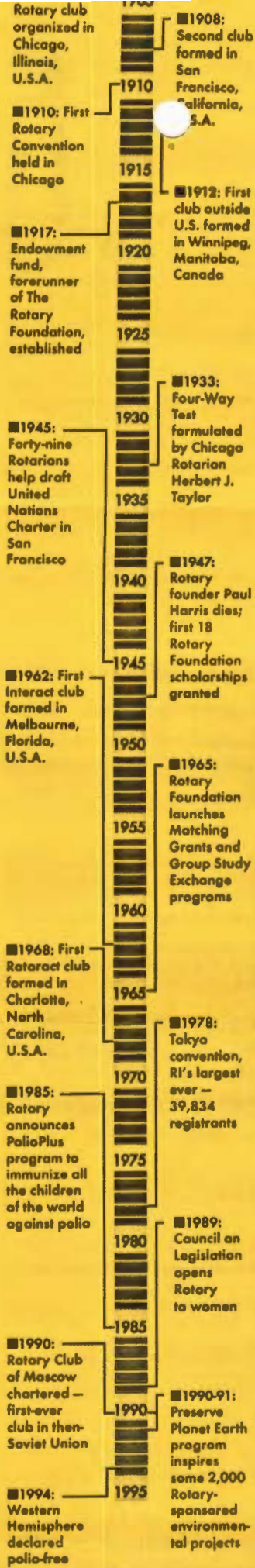

Lynn Powers has three college acceptances so far, and expects more. She plays tennis and is thinking about being a geneticist and majoring in biology and psychology.

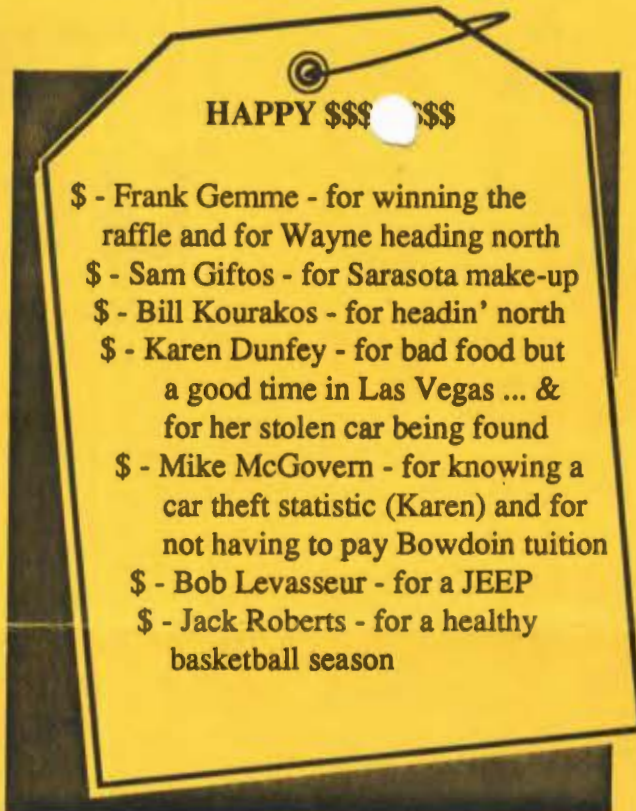

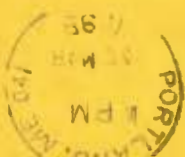

In Our Memories
A. Leonard King, Jr.
1942-1995

Wednesday night's meeting was a somber gathering, as members tried to deal with the unexpected loss of A. Leonard King, Jr. Len, as most knew him in the club, was on everyone's mind. Just two weeks ago, at what proved to be his last meeting, he presided over the club.

Len joined the club in November of 1988. Prior to that, in 1979 he founded and was the president of the Casco Bay Group, an employee benefits and pension management company. Len leaves behind a wife of 32 years, Carol, a son, John and a daughter, Diane.

The Wednesday night program was canceled as members were given an opportunity to reflect on their thoughts of Len. Many of the members had some wonderful things to say. I just hope I can convey some of these sentiments as well.

Frank Gemme spoke of Len's true love for the outdoors. He said Len was always eager to talk about his trips into the wilds. Bill York spoke of how anytime he needed to borrow Len's pickup in the fall he would always say, "Come right over." That was just the kind of guy Len was, no questions asked.

Mike McGovern recalled having a conversation three weeks ago with Len and how nervous he was at the thought of running the meeting. Fortunately Len did not have to run that meeting, although he knew that he would the next week's. During the conversation, Mike noted that he was probably going to miss Len's meeting the next week. Len, after much cajoling, convinced Mike to come, and Mike spoke of how glad he was to be at that meeting in hindsight, but also at the time because as Mike said, "Len really knew how to run a meeting."

Dan Davidson spoke of how he convinced Len to vote for Angus King for governor, not for any of the reasons that Dan had given but because Len thought he had a great last name! Bob Carson spoke of how ironic it was that the last meeting that Len made at our club was the only one he presided over. Bob also said one of the best comments of the night when he said was all must cherish the fellowships we make through Rotary because sometimes, unfortunately, they can be fleeting.

By far the most lasting comments were made by Alec Livingston. Alec brought Len into the club back in 1988. Alec was closer to Len than anyone else in the club. He said just coming to the meeting this week was a painful decision. He thanked Frank for holding the meeting and allowing him the opportunity to speak. Alec recalled what a good family man that Len was. He said how he admired his relationships with his children. Len he said, lived the four way test in everything he did. After this, the meeting adjourned.

I have had the opportunity to know Len from the time I became a member in 1990. Len would almost always arrive for our meetings early, which would allow us an opportunity to talk. I don't know if it was because Len and I shared a similar view of politics or what, but we always had interesting conversations. This past year, Len took over my post as director of Community Services. As such, we had many conversations and meetings. The last time I saw Len was with the group at the soup kitchen serving out food to those less fortunate. It certainly is a fitting tribute that Len's last act as a rotarian was actively helping others. We must learn to cherish the fellowships we have as rotarians and as human beings because time marches on and our existence is truly fleeting.

As most of you may realize, this is a double issue. The following is a brief summary of our meeting for February 15. JoAnn Pike spoke to our club about the Good Shepherd Food Bank. JoAnn is the executive director of the bank as well as its founder. The Good Shepherd Food Bank was started in 1981 in JoAnn's garage. The bank is now located in a 40,000 square foot warehouse that is too small. What a food bank is, explained Pike, is a central clearing house for soup kitchens and pantries throughout the state. Basically, donations are taken to a single place and doled out to where the need is. The food bank is privately funded and takes no government money. The bank is allowed to collect maintenance fees of 14 cents a pound from the soup kitchens which allows it to operate. Many local companies such as Hannaford Bros., B&M and Barber Foods donate to the food bank and are generous in their support. Since our involvement has begun in the last year with the soup kitchen we can all see first hand the wonderful work the Good Shepherd Food Bank does. Thanks to JoAnn for an illuminating talk.

Frank Gemme presided over our meeting. Alec Livingston gave the invocation. Alec also introduced our many guests. Present that night were District Governor elect George Rice and his wife, Jenny. Also present were Tim Burns and his wife, Ellen from the Scarborough Club, Sandy Bliss and her husband, David from the Westbrook-Gorham Club and Bruce Court from the Windham Club.
