# Program: "Field for Cape Kids" Committee:

Steve Goldstein, Dan Fisher and Mike Roy unveiled an ambitious proposal to construct two new multi-purpose ball fields in Cape. The Committee is an extension of the little league and the soccer programs. The fields are much needed given the number of kids participating in little league and soccer every year. One of the fields would be built at Lions Field and the other at Fort Williams.

According to Dan, he and John Chapman approached the Fort Williams Advisory Committee about a year and half ago to see if any space was available for new ball fields. They discovered that the Fort Williams Master Plan shows space near the lighthouse that was designated for future use as a multi-purpose field. They mobilized their forces and have decided to construct both fields without the use of public funds. The first of the ball fields is proposed to be built at the Fort. Mike made it clear that their would be no lights, loudspeakers or concession stands - just a ball field. Once the Fort Williams field is constructed, the committee would focus on the space at Lions field. They indicated that that could be a tougher site given the slope and the wetland setback issues.

Steve Goldstein announced that a \$300,000 capital campaign would kick-off May 18th with a reception at the Inn by the Sea. The Group hopes to utilize proven fundraising techniques that the kids can participate in such as coin jars in local businesses, car washes, candy sales and button and t-shirt sales. The Group is also looking for corporate sponsors, benefactors and in-kind contributions. The initial fundraising efforts have already generated approximately \$25,000 and this year's efforts will end with a banquet and auction at the Eastland Plaza on 10/21.

President Gemme indicated that the Club was interested in helping and that we would be meeting with the Committee in the near future to decide just how. We wish the "Fields" Committee much success and we know that "if you build it, they will come".

#### FROM THE BOARD ROOM

The Board of Directors met after the May 10 meeting and took action on two issues which had been under consideration for a few months.

CASA. You may have heard in the news about the movement in South Portland by the Citizens Against Substance Abuse. This is community effort to institute program in the high schools aimed at preventing substance abuse. DARE program, which the club supports, is aimed at substance abuse by wo preventing abuse by working chool students. working with middle school recognition of the need continued prevention efforts in the high school, and the widespread nature of the problem, the Board authorized a contribution of \$1000 to CASA to help get this program off the ground.

2. Maine Community Loan Fund. This program makes home loans to Maine individuals who could not otherwise afford to own their own homes. The Board agreed to loan \$3000 to the program for one year, with possible renewal after that time. This loan differs from depositing our money in the bank in two ways:

\*We will receive a lower interest rate. For the one year period, it is estimated that we will give up about \$100. This is viewed by the Board as a donation in the area of Community Service.

\*The loan is not insured. However the Loan Fund's Board consists of respected astute business men & women (including Bob Danielson) whom the club's Board felt could be trusted to make wise decisions. The loan fund has an excellent track record and any potential losses would be shared by others in the pool. Therefore the Board felt that the risk of losing a significant amount of money was extremely small.

In other business the Board decided that it would be more practical to present scholarship checks at graduation rather than at Christmas. Tara Nisbet for induction in the National Honor Society.



# THE MAY 31 MEETING

We didn't have quite so many visitors at the May 31 meeting, but we were happy to have with us visiting Rotarians John Perry and Rich Berube, as well as **Dr. Peter Webber**, a guest of Paul Butler. Another visiting Rotarian from the Lewiston-Auburn club was our speaker Roger Stricker, who spoke to us at the invitation of Bob Carson.

Roger is the Director of the Maine Drug Enforcement Agency, a position which he took over in 1994 after retiring as chief of the Auburn Police Dept. The Agency was \$1 million in debt when Roger took over and hadn't paid its bills in 7 months. As a result, the number of agents is now only half of what it was in 1992. Roger deplored the level of spending on drug enforcement in Maine: less than \$1 million/yr, placing Maine 45th in the nation. He said that we "need to start shoveling against the tide of crack cocaine before it becomes an epidemic." Thanks Roger and Bob for this enlightening program!


