April 2, 1997 **Ted Spitzer Portland Public Market**

Ted is Project Director for the Market, which will begin its site work in May and open next spring at a cost of \$4.7 million. The new Market, Ted says, "Will affirm the value of buying from local farmers."

A project initiated and paid for by Betty Noyse, the Market will be in the Preble St. area near the newly-constructed indoor parking garage. It will be designed primarily to attract local patronage, not tourists. There will be no trinket or T-shirt sales.

Ted showed us some slides of other public markets such as the famous one in Seattle. He also showed some of the architectural drawings of the exterior and interior.

It is hoped there will be about 30 to 35 businesses in the market, including produce, meats, fish, flowers, specialty products, and probably a restaurant. There will also be special events designed to attract customers.





Helio Medina of Fairchild Semiconductor, substituting for Laurenz Schmidt, gave a brief background and history of Ingraham (Helio is also a volunteer there), and introduced the principal speaker Executive Director Jane Morrison.

We learned that Ingraham last year responded to more than 42,000 phone calls. The organization helped thousands of people with food, shelter, medical care, fuel, transportation, suicide intervention, domestic violence, crisis intervention, and various other support services.

Jane told us that Ingraham began a new service on March 3: Cumberland County Crisis Response. This new program will be available 24 hours a day and its volunteers will go on-site to provide help.

April 23, 1997 TECHNOLOGY IN CAPE SCHOOLS

Jay Trevorrow, Technology Coordinator in the Cape Schools System, was introduced by Dan Davidson. Jay spoke on "Casting the People Net; how technology will change education in Cape's Schools."

Cape is in the 2nd year of a 5-year technology plan. As part of establishing the school computer network, many volunteers have been donating their time and talents -- high school students (some of whom have their own businesses in computer consulting), SMTC technical volunteers, teachers, the Technical Committee, school maintenance staff members.

Jay says there are 1500 drops in the system and SMTC has terminated more than 1000 so far.

"We're creating a model for using volunteer talent to set up the network at little cost," says Jay.

He adds, "Digital networks will globalize our experiences. Our children, for example, should be able to interact with others worldwide."

Jay believes technology will decentralize our educational processes and gives as examples:

- digital experiences are going on now in Maine in the home schooling program;

- e-mail is in use by our students;



They are currently using 10 hp motors to raise and lower the leaves for ship traffic (these will be replaced with two 75 hp motors for each leaf)?

By using the concrete from the old bridge to form a harbor-view park, the bridge project will save \$1 million?

CELEBRATING JOAN SAMUELSON

On June 5 several club members gathered with town officials, Joan Benoit Samuelson and her family and friends to re-dedicate her statue in front of the library and to dedicate the landscaping surrounding the statue. The landscaping (brick patio, benches, shrubs and plantings) was done last fall through funding of \$4500 provided by our club. On behalf of the town, Janet McLaughlin thanked the Rotary club, represented by President Wayne Goodrich. Other club members present included Dan Gacetta, Mike McGovern, Jim & Vicke Russell, Dan Davidson, Jeff Gabrielson, Bill Stanton, Jack Roberts and Nancy Hawes.

ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION

Another project recently funded by our club is a photography program at SPHS. Our speaker for the June 4 meeting, Tom Hyland, requested funding from our club to develop the photography program as part of the Alternative Education program that he directs at the high school. Tom told us about how growing up as one of 10 kids in a 3 1/2 room apartment, he learned to appreciate diversity and the need for cooperation. He has devoted his career to helping students who may need a little extra help because of their different learning styles. Originally charged to keep kids from dropping out of school when he took his position at SPHS, he has expanded his mission to not only keeping them from dropping out but helping them to be successful in school. Tom feels that the addition of a photography program will teach students a skill, will help to motivate them to be interested in school and learning, and will help them to improve their writing skills as well. Tom was a very impassioned speaker, and we thank him and Joe Conroy for this great program.

MORE GOOD DEEDS

After the June 4 meeting, the Board met briefly to approve two funding requests. One was a request from **Karen Dunfey** on behalf of the District's Youth Exchange committee to re-allocate \$500 of money previously approved for youth exchange students our club was to sponsor, to a student from Gorham who needs help with travel expenses. The money became available when we had a cancellation by one of the students we were to have sponsored. Ordinarily travel expenses are the responsibility of the student and Rotary clubs do not cover this cost. Occasionally exceptions are made however, and Karen thought this student was worthy of making an exception.

The other expenditure approved was a matching grant project to provide basic necessities - furniture and a toilet facility - for a charitable primary school in India. The request came from District Governor Nominee Marie Williams on behalf of the DGN of the District in India. The club in India would match the \$2100 that they are requesting; the combined \$4200 would in turn be matched by the Rotary Foundation for a total of \$8400.

Warren Simpson, Dan Mooers, Sam Giftos, and Joe Conroy went on a road trip to visit the Rotary club which meets in Paul Harris' schoolhouse. 

REMINDERS FOR THE SUMMER

Although we are not professionals in the food business, our customers expect us to maintain the same health standards that a professional establishment would. Therefore in order not to give our customers food poisoning, or injure ourselves for that matter, I offer the following reminders for the upcoming food-selling season.

1. You can handle money or food but not both simultaneously. If you are taking money from customers, either refrain from touching food or clean your hands first. We have a large supply of packets of pre-moistened towelettes for this purpose.

2. Ditto for raw chicken. It our job is to put uncooked chicken on the grih, clean your hands before moving to another job or touching the cooked chicken. Same goes for tools - tools or dishes that are used for uncooked chicken need to be kept separate.

3. The refrigerator may not be cold. The refrigerator does a relatively poor job of keeping food cold, especially if the sun is shining on it. We need to make sure the refrigerator doors are closed tightly, and keep opening and closing the doors to a minimum.

4. The fryolator is hot. Matt Dube or one of the other people who has been burned by hot grease can confirm this. Also we need to make sure that children do not play near that end of the trailer.

Let's be careful out there!


