We are also participating in a Matching Grant project with a club from India, and hope to identify another matching grant opportunity by the end of the year.

prisoners all over the country for trial and for incarceration-about 1300 per day). The Fugitive Investigation Division obtains 75% of all federal arrests in this country. The Asset Forfeiture Division manages and distributes the forfeited money and property to different agencies. The U.S. Marshal Service provides help with terrorists, national disasters, high profile trials....is there anything these guys don't do? Thank you to Larry Gilbert, and Jeff Gabrielson for bringing us such an interesting program.

Show Rotary Cares

Tony Payne from Maine Employers Mutual Company brought us a very interesting update on the state of the Workmen's Compensation Program in the State of Maine. As most of us are aware, in 1991 then Gov. John McKernan shut down the State Government for 3 weeks to force the legislature to look at Workmen's Comp Reform, since ours was one of the worst states in the country in this area. In 1993 Me. Employers Mutual formed the self-insured company that now insures 58% of employers in this state. The effort has been on improving the safety culture in the workplace and reducing needless and expensive litigation. The bottom line-it is working. Statistics from 1993 show 19,800 cases of weeks lost from work due to an injury vs. 13,000 in 1996. That savings affects everyone with the saved revenues being channelled into more positive things in our economy. Thank you to Bill Daviero for such an interesting program to the club.







Peter attends Geogetown University majoring in economics.

Patrick stated that the area he was living, Winositio, was a very dynamic urban area whose population were very well educated, dispelling the common conception of all of South America as a poor, uneducated people.Patrick saw many interesting things while in Argentina, perhaps the most interesting being a country rebounding from a dictatorship to the system of democracy. The signs of old times were still present with the weekly Wednesday vigils/rallies held by "The Mothers of Those That Disappeared"- mothers of young people who disagreed with, or opposed government policy between 1976-1983 who were never heard from again.

On a more uplifting note, Patrick visited many countries including Colombia, Brazil, Chile, Bolivia and Ecuador (his least favorite), as well as the lost Incan ruins in Peru. It seemed as though social unrest and guerilla warfare followed him closely, although he stated that he never felt unsafe.

Rotary is very active and visible in all of South America- Patrick said that when you came into a town the first two things you saw were a Coca-Cola sign, then the Rotary emblem. Patrick visited 11 different Rotary clubs while he was away; they typically have about 25 members, the smallest club that Patrick met with had seven members (I'll bet that they do not have to staff a Christmas tree sale there!!) Some of the questions that Patrick was asked by the folks he visited went from the very superficial, "Why are all Americans so fat?" to questions on the American position on Cuba. Partrick was a very articulate speaker and an excellent ambassador for our country

The idea behind these exchanges is to promote better world understanding and harmony by allowing exchanges of ideas and culture Over 1000 students participate annually in this program, with Rotary Inmternational funding between \$20 to \$30 million dollars for the program. From the interesting talk that Patrick gave (and what we will hear from our GSE representative next week), it works!


HELP!!!

Substance Abuse

Our own Bob Flynn was our speaker Wednesday evening. The subject of Bob's talk was the Substance Abuse Program which Bob has been working on for our Club. Some history; Bob was the Community Services Director for two years prior to this Rotary year. During the interview process to select candidates for the Ryla Program, Bob was struck by the discussions he had with the students regarding substance abuse; all of the kids said that there was a problem in their schools with these things, all of the students said that alcohol and marijuana were the most prevalent. It was clear that these kids felt that existing drug programs were ineffective; "kids do not want to listen to what adults have to say". Working on this premise, Bob had the idea to put together a program created by kids, to present to other kids. Bob came to the Board of Directors of our club for help (\$\$) to get this going, which was granted. This will be a multi-media program (audio, visual, graphically interesting) to get the kids attention. It will be interactive, not just a presentation. Bob sees this as students doing the filming, interviewing, etc. and they will get school credit for participating. The students will also do presentations to large companies for financial backing. (with a Rotarian).

Ultimately, Bob is hoping to put together a system where different groups or clubs could take it and customize it to suit their area. To do this, we are going to need to raise money from other clubs (our club has paid to get the prototype going). Bob may be asking for some help in visiting other clubs and doing presentations (he has alrerady met with the Bridgton and Fryeburg Clubs with good results). If we can get this program up and running, it could have far reaching consequences. Bob has put much time and effort into this program-let's give him our support, and any help he needs in continuing. Thank you Bob for such an interesting meeting!

Eleanor Brainin introduced Jane Sheehan, the Vice President of Administration of the Foundation for Blood Research: her assistant. Harriet Dawson also assisted. The Foundation is a non-profit organization started 30 years ago; they do tests for all the pre-natal screening in Maine.

"Science Works" is another program of the Foundation to help school science teachers. The program helps supplement high school science programs with needed supplies and knowledge, to help ensure a scientifically literate public. They also assist in re-distributing overstocked or unused science supplies to high schools. This is an excellent opportunity for companies to donate used equipment; the Foundation refurbishes and services the equipment and distributes it. To date, over \$1,000,000 worth of equipment has been distributed among more than 100 schools, and over 180 teachers have attended workshops.

The Foundation is affiliated with the University of Southern Maine (Program of Endicrinology); this department actually conducts classes at the Foundation.
