Frank reported that Eduardo is married and is very happily working for Citibank in Argentina- he sends our Club his best.

### Armchair Trip To Russia

**Mason Phillip Smith** (a former member of our Club) was our speaker. Mason has a very interesting background as an author, a runner and primarily as a prominent photojournalist. He has travelled to Russia many times and shared some of his impressions with us. Facts: Average life expectancy for a Russian man? 56 yrs. (some regions, 47 years)

Region where Mason visited- population was 450,000, number of cars, 10,000- number of gas stations, 4..... Little different than this country....

Mason described a somewhat stark country of friendly people (most of whom have an enduring connection to WWII and their families' experiences of that period).

The food is simple, much of it grown in gardens (Mason said that everyone has a garden, including city-dwellers who travel to their plot). That would make sense since

45% of Russia's food supply is imported. "Bush chicken" represents the deal that allowed our country to export poultry to the area during the Bush Administration. Rents are high -2 room apartment with a toilet room (without a toilet seat) would rent for \$16.00 American/ month (seems inexpensive to us, but Mason's friend Aunt Bella lives on a pension of \$43 American/ month)

Typical salaries: School principal- \$200.00/mo (U.S) English teacher-\$305/mo, but because of graft had not been paid in 2 years. This family had eaten no meat in 2 years, not because they were vegetarians, meat was too expensive.

Voting is taken very seriously by the Russians (although all but one person that Mason met voted for Yeltsin)

These things ser off than 4 years ago?" most Russians would answer, yes. Even though they have little money, they do not have to wait in long lines to get the basics, as they once did.

Thank you **Phil Dube** for bringing such an interesting program to the Club.

Wayne Goodrich brought Paul Violette, the Executive Director of the Maine Turnpike Authority to speak to us. The Turnpike Authority was created in 1941 because the State did not have resources to build the highway. The Authority borrowed \$15 million to construct the first portion of the Turnpike. After its construction, the Turnpike carried 1,000,000 cars; in 1996 it carried 43,000,000 cars (75% of those cars travel in the 40 miles south of Portland. In fact, 90% of all the trucked goods that Maine people use travel the Pike, and 92% of Maine exports are trucked over it.

The Turnpike is not subsidized by the Federal or State Government- all its revenues are derived by tolls. The Turnpike raises \$43 million in revenues, and spends \$8 million in toll collection alone. The Transpass system will reduce the cost of collection to \$4,500,000.

The Maine Turnpike Authority wants to widen the road on its busiest section (area south of Portland). A referendum in November, while not required, will be needed to have the widening happen (since it is such a politically charged issue). Before casting your vote, think of the safety issues: the accident ratio on a 2 lane highway is much greater than one on a 3 lane highway, especially given the truck traffic which uses the pike south of Portland. All the recent infra-structure improvements (bridges, interchanges, etc.) took the potential widening into consideration, so it will not have to be modified. Due to the increased volume, the congestion and the safety issues, the Maine Turnpike Authority is advocating the widening.

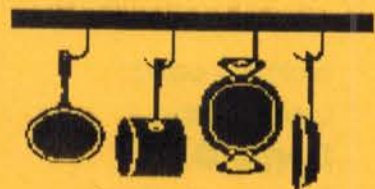

## SOUP KITCHEN



Our Club was well represented at the Soup Kitchen last Tuesday evening.. Those in attendance were **Bill Stanton** (as always!), **Bob Packer**, **Alec Livingston**, **Bill Daviero**, **Rick and Diane Dobson**, **Phil Dube**, **Mike Mc Govern**, **Paul Butler** and **Joe Conroy**. Since about 268 diners were served, all the help was needed. This is a very worthwhile endeavor for our Club; it really helps you to appreciate what you have. Thanks to everyone who participated.

**Don Day** brought Rachel White and Julie Lipez from Cape Elizabeth High School to speak about their experiences at the World Affairs Seminar at the University of Wisconsin at Whitewater last summer. (Our Club sponsored Rachel and Julie at the seminar).

The Seminar included 1300 students representing 52 different countries throughout the world. The theme of the seminar was "Security"; personal security, economic security, international security, etc. Different speakers did presentations for the students, then had question and answer periods followed by small round table discussions. Rachel and Julie had several very interesting perspectives to share with us; regarding terrorists who are usually religiously or politically motivated: "One man's freedom fighter is another man's terrorist".

Religion plays a big part in many conflicts throughout the world- Bishop William Spring stated that "until there is peace among religions, there will never be peace among nations". The girls met a boy from N. Ireland, whose family has long-standing ties with the IKA. He spoke about going back to his homeland with some of the ideas gleaned from the conference and how they could impact his homeland.

The girls also spoke about some of the Americans taking a somewhat ego-centric view of our country, and being brought up a bit from some of the international students. We, as a country, focus on our country's actions and not on the consequences of these actions on others; a woman spoke who was growing up in Nagasaki (she was 6 when the bomb went off). Her point of view on that incident gave the students a different perspective on how that impacted her life.

Listening to these young women share their experiences with us was interesting, as well as reassuring that this is a very worthwhile project for our Club to support. It is nice to see and hear first hand the benefits of what we support. Thank you Rachel and Julie, as well as Don Day for bringing us such an interesting program!

Adrienne Murphy introduced our program on Wednesday; she was standing in for Eleanor Brainin. (Eleanor had been recovering from the flu and had a relapse after attending a Rolling Stones concert the night before). Our speaker was Kathy Freund, founder and Executive Director of the Independent Transportation Network (ITN). This group targets the older person or visually impaired individual who cannot drive (or should not be driving.) When people can no longer drive, it gives them a feeling of a lack of control over their lives. These individuals tend to feel isolated; being dependent on others for transportation, having to work schedules around rides from others is demeaning. As Kathy pointed out, in this situation, most individuals choose to do nothing and stop going out. ITN was started with these people in mind.

ITN is a non-profit organization that provides a ride to people 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. Fees are very reasonable, and there is a great deal of flexibility in scheduling. The service has some paid drivers, but relies primarily on volunteers, who typically volunteer for 3 hours a month. No money changes hands; clients draw on accounts set up for them (by themselves or by family members.) What a great way to offer independence for those that do not have it!

There are many volunteers including Tom Allen, Mark Stimson, Linda Abromson, Wally Camp among them. 3 hours a month- what a small amount of time to offer that would benefit someone and help them feel independent! After all, we are all going to be in that boat at some time (some of us sooner than others!) If you are interested in getting more information, or to sign up as a volunteer ITN's phone number is 828-8608. Thank you Eleanor for bringing this valuable program to us.

As part of Vocational Services Month, our speaker was our own Bob Howe doing a classification talk. Bob's classification is architecture. Architects must be licensed by the state (licensure is state specific-each state has their own requirements) There is a great deal of education required for this field; 7 years of specific courses, and then another 3 years of working in the field before one can sit for the exam (4 day exam). There are currently 60,000 NCAR registered architects in this country; 300 licensed in Maine (this is a very high density for architects based on our state's population). Bob pointed out that being an architect is not just working with sketches and drawings, but it is a very service-oriented profession. The biggest changes in the way architects work has come with the significant advances in technology- from large, slow machines, to compact, super-fast CAD computers.

Bob pointed out that when considering architecture as a vocation, problem solving and good management skills are much more important than having good drawing skills. Bob showed us many slides of local projects that Therrien Architects has been involved with including So. Portland High School, Cumberland County Courthouse and especially King Middle School. The design of King Middle School was a challenge to bring a visual connection for the students to the exterior of the building. The creativity and success of that project led to a Greater Portland Landmarks Award for the firm. Thank you Bob for giving us a much better understanding of a field many were unfamiliar with.

Joe Conroy thanked all those who contributed to the Soup Kitchen effort this past Tuesday evening; Joe & Ibbey Conroy, Bill Stanton, Adrienne Murphy, President Jim Russell and Paul Butler. It was very busy, so our efforts are very much needed and appreciated.

### Christmas Tree Dates

11/22, Saturday- Lot Setup- 9:00 a.m.

11/28, Friday - Unloading 7:00 a.m.

Nancy Hawes introduced Cape Elizabeth Fire Chief Phil McGouldrick as our program; Chief McGouldrick's topic was fire safety, especially around the holidays.

Chief McGouldrick's recommendations:

- In 2 minutes a cigarette fire can take over a room with temperature of 1500 degrees Fahrenheit
- All homes should have smoke detectors; they save lives everyday. Building code requirements now call for the detectors to be wired in (not battery). There are new battery units made that have 10 year batteries. The Fire Dept. will help you select the right type of smoke detector, and locate them properly (for example, there should be one in your attic)
- Residential sprinkler systems avoid serious fires and death (at a cost of \$1.50 per square foot). There has never been multiple deaths in a house equipped with a sprinkler system
- Home owners should have a plan, and practice fire drills- everyone must have 2 ways to get out. During a fire, thick black smoke often makes getting out of a building very difficult- pre-planning adds to the chances of getting out safely.
- Be sure that your house is marked well (large house numbers) Often emergency personnel are unable to find the right house in an emergency

Regarding Christmas trees:

- only use tree lights that are UL approved (never use indoor lights outside (and vice versa)
- get a good quality extension cord, one that is the right size for the load- cheap ones cause many fires
- always turn lights off when you leave the house (or go to bed)
- be sure trees are fresh (dry trees are more susceptible to fire
- tell customers to trim 2 inches off the tree trunk right before setting up tree- use plenty of water
- never use candles on a tree; never leave candles unattended

The 2500 fire safety brochures will be at the tree lot for distribution; play it safe over the holidays.

## Maine Tourmaline

**Jeff Hobbs** presented **Karen Pride** from Cross Jewelers as our speaker. **Karen's** topic was "the most beautiful piece of Maine" or Maine tourmaline. Maine tourmaline is found primarily in the western mountains of Maine

Mount Mica was the first site of discovery in 1820 at Mount Mica (the same year Maine was admitted into the Union). The find was quite by accident by two student minerologists who noticed a bright green shiny crystal clinging to a tree root. (Sorry the bulletin editor does not have their names but she writing in the dark due to the slide show- deciphering any notes at all was a challenge!). At any rate, this was the first sign of a he very large cache of the precious stones.

Tourmaline was formed 500 million years ago by volcanic rock that settled in the crevices of the granite and hardened over the years. There is a wide belt of these minerals running from the coast of Maine at Georgetown digonally through the state to South Paris.

In 1972 the largest, most significant discovery of tourmaline was discovered at Prumbago Mountain (located on International Paper Land) Over 200 pounds a day were mined (a 13 in by 4 inch gem from there is on display at the Smithsonian). In all, over \$50,000,000 of tourmaline was excavated from this site.

The quality, size and brilliance of the tourmaline gemstones here has made Maine famous- the stones found here are considered by experts to be the finest in the world. That is why tourmaline is called "the most beautiful piece of Maine". Thank you **Jeff** for bringing this interesting program to the Club.

Our program speaker was **Dan Mooers**, reporting on his trip as a Rotary Volunteer to Russia. Dan was given the red carpet treatment by his Rotary host families (he had three).

Dan's mission to Russia was to speak to groups (primarily university students) about the application of the Bill of Rights in our country, and the role of non-profit organizations. Dan was amazed how again and again, the idea of voluntarily doing charitable things for those that you did not know was incomprehensible to the Russians. This was true on a small scale as well as the ideas of Rotary and the global picture. An example Dan shared was a group of foster mothers who met to promote foster parenting. One woman told about wanting to take in another youngster who was homeless and living on the street. The caseworker felt that the mother was overburdened as it was. The woman acknowledged this but stated that if she did not take in this child, he would remain alone with no home. The caseworker told the woman that it was “not her problem.” 90 years of repression have taken its toll on the culture and attitudes of these people.

Dan told of the serious deterioration of the infrastructure everywhere he went because of the economy (bad enough that the schools have dark halls since lightbulbs are expensive and therefore scarce) Food is available (if you can afford it- it is expensive); health care is poor, infant mortality is increasing rapidly. The Russian Rotary Clubs (many very young clubs) new have taken up the challenge with a vengeance with very aggressive programs to help. With all that is needed there, there is a big challenge which these clubs have accepted (even though the culture there makes their motives at times a little suspicious to contemporaries) Dan, thank you so much for sharing your insights to our club in a very informative program. Space does not allow me to fully capture the feeling of the program; suffice to say it made me feel very thankful on the eve of Thanksgiving!
