Bob Flynn introduced our speaker Wednesday evening. We were lucky to have the opportunity to hear Lucky Hollander speak on her experiences as the Division Director with the Child Abuse and Neglect Council. Lucky was born in Greece and settled here in Maine to take this position. The main focus of the Council is preventing abuse from happening in the first place, not facilitating shelters and avenues to help the damage of abuse after it occurs. She finds it frustrating to help kids after the fact since we do know how to prevent the abuse.

Lucky relayed a wrenching story of encountering a young teenager who had been seriously burned as a child (Lucky dealt with him at that time and worked out a strategy and game plan to change the path of destruction in this boys family). Years later, she was re-acquainted with the young teen; the strategy had been interrupted and all of the negative consequences Lucky had predicted had come true. Very sad.

The three avenues of prevention the council utilizes are; education, advocacy (better public policies) and outreach (targetting at-risk families)

One of the programs Lucky told us about was: "Baby, Think it Over". This program uses computerized dolls to simulate the realities of caring for an infant. The dolls scream incessantly just as real babies do; computer readings evaluate how the doll has been handled by the teen over the period of several days. The evaluations are designed to educate, not recriminate the teens. Lucky points out that child abuse is not usually planned; it is a spontaneous event, often stemming from frustration and at times, ignorance. The program targets middle school children because this is the group that is forming patterns of behavior and lifestyle habits that will take them into high school, and so are the most at risk. All kids could be at risk; teen pregnacy crosses all lines, racially and economically.

This was an excellent program; thank you Ms. Hollander for speaking to us and to Bob Flynn for providing the opportunity.

Obviously this attention to the consumer is paying off. I also heard heartfelt gratitude for the overwhelming support of the Portland Seadogs. The team has added a lot to our area, and brought much enjoyment to many people. Thank you Dan for bringing such a seasonally appropriate (and enjoyable) program

Frank Gemme introduced our Program Wednesday evening. Our guest speaker was Gary Fifield, head coach of the USM Ladies Huskies Basketball Team,. Unless you have been marooned on a desert island, you know that the Ladies' Huskies competed in the fianal game of the NCAA Division 3 Championship.

Gary has been the coach as USM for over ten years, compiling an impressive record of 246 wins/45 losses; the team qualifying for NCAA postseason play 12 of the last 13 years and the Little East Champs 9 times in 13 years. Pretty impressive.

The NCAA Division 3 Final Four games were held in our area, with the championship game being played at USM. The television coverage was extensive and has brought great visibility to the Huskies. Even though the USM team eventually lost to Washington University at St. Louis, it was an exciting game nevertheless.

Gary explained that the differences in Division 1, 2 & 3 play has less to do with the size of the schools, but more with philosophy of play. At Division 1 schools, larger numbers of scholoarships are awarded, less in Division 2, and none in Division 3. There is a great deal of pressure on the scholarship athletes; studies become secondary to the sports. Division 3 schools often pick up players who shied away from the pressure and regimentation of the Division 21 school. These players play for their love of the game, not for the financial reimbursement.

This was a great program; thank you Gary Fifield for sharing your insaights with us.



Alec Livingston introduced our speaker Wednesday evening, Dr. David Burkey. Dr. Burkey is affiliated with Maine Cardiology Associates. Alec had a first hand view into the world of cardiovascular medicine last year, as you may recall, and Dr. Burkey went from being a client to a saviour (did Dr. Burkey's pre-


miums go down any?).

Dr. Burkey pointed out that the cardiovascular facility at Maine Medical Center is top notch (and the second busiest facility this side of New York City). Coronary heart disease affects 1.4 trillion people a year in this country (10 times greater than in England), and is the leading cause of death in our country. The most dangerous time during coronary disease is before you know you have it. The symptoms of angina are often mistaken for something else (indigestion, hand numbness, pains in the back, etc), so proper attention is not given the problem. There is a 30% chance a person will die in the first hour following an attack; getting to a hospital increases one's chances considerably.

High risk factors include high blood pressure, high cholesterol and tobacco use. Prevention and having healthy, clear arteries are the best protection against heart disease (exercise and a healthy diet contribute to good arterial health- "If it tastes good, don't eat it")

Technology is moving quickly-radiation as a treatment is right around the corner, laser surgery, etc.Dr. Burkey stated that while there is no food that lowers cholesterol, alchohol in moderation does. Aspirin is the single most important drug in secondary prevention. Any dose will do the job.

This was a very interesting program, thanks to Dr. Burkey and Alec for bringing it to our Club.



GOOD CHIROPRACTIC HEALTH

Keith Mc Alary introduced Dr. Stuart Cayer as our speaker. Stuart grew up with Keith in Madawaska, attended the University of Maine and went on to Auburn College of Chiripractors. Chiropractics (bone manipulation) is an old idea, going back to ancient times.

D B Palmer was the real groundbreaker in this field; in 1895 he was studying anatomy and came on a man who had been deaf for 17 years after feeling a "pop" in his neck. After being manipulated for several weeks, his hearing returned. Mr. Palmer made the link between the correlation between the bones and nerves and general physiology.

Schooling for chiropractors is similar to regular doctors but they do not do a residency. Instead of pharmacology, etc. the chiropractors attend spinal analy-

sis, etc..

Rather than taking an opposite view of medicine than regular doctors, chiropractor begin using more restrained methods of treatments and progressing to more aggressive strategies. I found it interesting that Stuart's undergrad degree was in electrical engineering. The analogies he drew to electrical engineering and chiropractics, and how very similar the processes were very interesting.



The GSE Team From Finland



The Group Study Exchange Team from Finland joined us and shared their experiences of these past three weeks. All agreed that they had enjoyed themselves very much here (all agreed that they welcomed the opportunity to stay put in one host Rotarians house for 5 days in a row, rather than movevery two nights). Their experiences and impressions were varied; they were surprised at how much "healthier" Americans were from years ago (smoke much less that Europeans and fat-free "everything" is available here) All enjoyed meeting and getting to know the host families they have stayed with. Things are a little different in Finland in many ways; the people there are taxed at a rate of 35%, with an added 22% added value tax (similar to our sales tax). Finns recieve free health care, unemployed people are paid when they are not working and families incur no expenses for attending college. 60% of Finland is forested and pulp and paper is a big industry for them, as well as steel making and telecommunications such as cell phone production (Nokia is a Finnish company) Many of the large cruise ships are built in Finland, too.

Trivia: there are 187,880 lakes and 179,584 islands in Finland.

As always, the GSE Team experience was an educational and interesting one for everyone involved.

We welcomed two new members Wednesday evening; Joan Houghton live on Old Colony Lane in Cape Elizabeth with her husband Amory (they have 6 children). Joan is a mental health advocate; she enjoys gardening, hiking and sailing.



Dan Gacetta led a timely version of "You Are My Sunshine" to kick off our meeting (the only "Sunshine" we have had in a while!!!)


Frank Butterworth is very happy to have his son home from a exchange trip to Mexico (and he will be happy when Family Fun Day is over!)

Mark Boulanger introduced Don Perkins, the President of the Gulf of Maine Aquarium Development Corp. Don gave a very interesting talk on how the Aquarium Development has evolved over the last few years as a "partnership" of business people who got together to study the economic feasibility of the aquarium. The finished Aquarium will be located on the Navy Reserve Pier (across from Rufus Deering), will serve 850,000 visitors annually and provide 370 jobs at a cost of 42 million dollars.

Currently the Gulf Of Maine Aquarium group provides a world class educational program, incorporating computers, digital cameras, cell phones and e-mail as vehicles to transfer data

Funding for the construction of the Aquarium will be through both the private and public sector. There have already been several large donations, and the State of Mainehas a bond issue for funding going to the voters in the fall. As Mr. Perkins stated, they are approaching this fundraising like eating an elephant (one bite at a time)

Thanks to Don Perkins for coming to speak, and to MarkBoulanger for bringing such an interesting program
