Dan Davidson introduced our speaker Don Knisely from Community Health Services, which provide home health care services. These services are more cost effective and allow a patient to remain in their own familiar surroundings, which is more desirable to most people. Technology has improved so much that many procedures that were only done in a hospital years ago, can easily be administered in the home.

This is a very competitive field right now; 10 years ago there were only 2 agencies like this in Greater Portland, now there are 45! Medicare and Medicaid make up the insurers for most patients using these services; most insurance companies do cover these services as well.

With the vast changes in the medical field, home health care will only grow.

Please note: The following was extracted from a news release provided by Dan Davidson. "Brunswick, Maine--Maine's former Senator George Mitchell has worked tirelessly for peace in Northern

Ireland. Now Rotary International has joined the effort.

A Rotary program called "Friends

Forever" is bringing to this country ten teenage Protestants and Catholics (five each) to live and learn together in an environment of peace and education for two weeks. Rotarian Bill Holt (Rotary District 7780 coordinator of the program) says, "Friends Forever takes these teens out of their normal environment and, for two weeks, they are inseparable. We are trying to help them to unlearn hate. Rotary is trying to show Ireland's young people that we can work together, we can stop this bloodshed, we can have peace."

The Irish teens arrive October 18 and remain in Maine through November 1. They will be involved in many activities including:

155 buildings attacked and 130 homes assaulted.

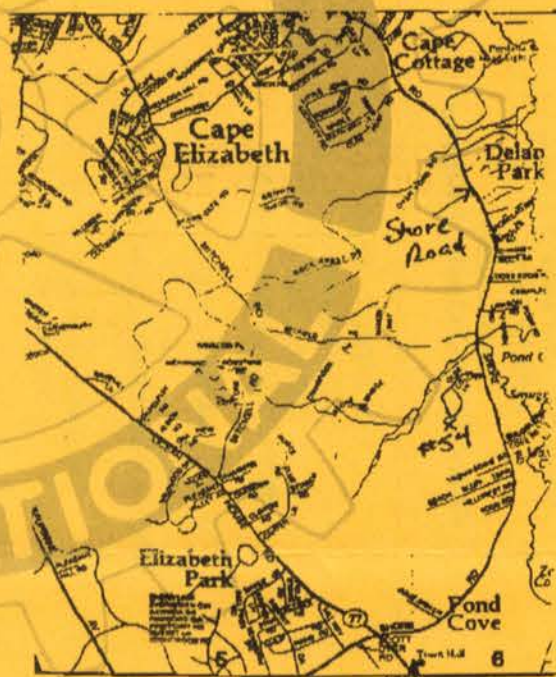

majority of terrorists are now looking to make a statement and receive exposure for their acts. They are attempting to kill more people during each act and make bigger statements than ever before. They receive this exposure by targeting U.S. buildings and locations.

In 1996 a survey showed that 81% of local and state

police felt that there was terrorist groups located in their cities. In the United States there are 66 Islamic extremist groups located throughout the country. One of the concerns of our government is that there are people siding with the terrorist group due to the diversity of people in the United States.

Jeff has also worked with cruise lines assist with counter-terrorist programs. Cruise lines are another large target by terrorists. Again because of their popularity with U.S. citizens. 84% of cruise passengers are Americans.

Jeff also spoke of other types of terrorism that

people do not realize or often overlook. For example, environmental extremists group, drug smuggling, cargo theft, illegal migration and piracy.

Jeff closed by providing other useful information regarding travel abroad. If you have any concerns or will be traveling abroad ask Jeff to provide you with sources of information on your travel and destinations.

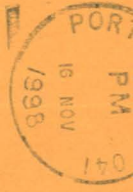
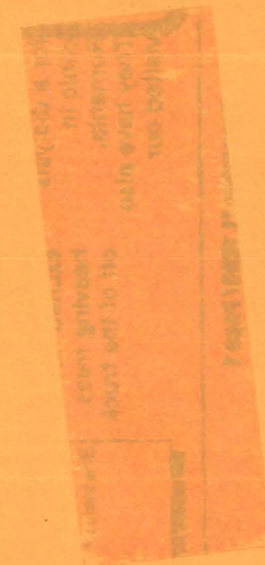

BETTER BUSINESS BUREAU OF MAINE

Dick Yerxa introduced our speaker Wayne Dobson from the Better Business Bureau of Maine. Wayne spoke of all that the BBB does for the area.

The BBB of Maine serves Maine, Vermont and Eastern Massachusetts. He moved to Maine after operating the BBB in Phoenix, Arizona.

For every 10,000 inquiries the BBB receives they only receive about 1,000 complaints. The BBB does not close businesses because they are not a regulatory agency. They do have the

authority however, to report on the ethical conduct of companies. The organization provides free arbitration and mediation services to both parties. The BBB does not lobby for specific political positions of organizations.

To become a member of the BBB your company must meet certain standards. Their standards are basically the same as the Rotary four way test. All members must do their part to take care of their customers and also use honest advertising.

One of the big issues that Wayne brought to our attention was scam charities. He warned us to be cautious when making

donations to organizations such as the Children's Wish Foundation, not the Make-A-Wish Foundation, and also to Police organizations. If you have never heard of the organization before, or do not know anyone that is a member of, or affiliated with the organization, ask the fund raiser for something from the organization. They possibly can provide you with names of other organizations in which they have helped.

The Better Business Bureau operates solely on membership fees of \$350 per business. If you are interested in becoming a member, please contact Wayne.

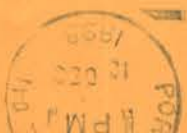
