March 31, 1999 **BONE MARROW DONATIONS** ED SUSLOVIC

Karen Dunfey introduced a dynamic Ed Suslovic who, ten years ago, registered as a donor. He then moved several times, yet got a call last year from the Registry asking for help for a 10-year-old boy.

Ed's initial reaction: "what if it were one of my kids who needed this help?" -- so he agreed. Ed read an emotional letter of gratitude from the boy's parents. Rules prohibit the parties from knowing each other for at least a year. The year has passed and Ed says this summer he is going to see the boy he helped, no

ter what. A wonderful letter from the boy agrees. Potential donors need only take a blood test to register. You must be under age 65 and in good health. Ed assured us it is NOT a painful procedure, during or after -- "That's a myth we need to dispell."

Ed says recruiting donors is not formalized; it has been, so far, only done by families of those in need. Ed plans to introduce a bill in the Maine legislature to require insurance companies to pay for one test per lifetime to encourage people to register (it costs \$65 to have the test done and the potential donor has to pay that cost). He'd like us all to support the bill.
