

October is Vocational Services Month.

Ever heard of an R.R.V.F.? It doesn't travel on wheels, although it can. It is not a self-contained tolling vacation home, although it can be a vacation.

It is, however, a Rotary Recreational and Vocational Fellowship Rotarians from around the world can participate in fellowships with others, sharing their same interests. Some fellowships get together often during the year, while others may see each other only once, at the annual Rotary International Convention.

There are roughly 40 recreational fellowships in existence, ranging from Amateur 'Radio Operation to Yachting. The focus of these activities is generally directed towards serving others. A canoe trip may be organized to clean up a polluted area, or a golf tournament may be organized to benefit charity. Whatever the interest of the beneficiary, members enjoy sliming interests and partaking of some wonderful fellowship opportunities.

Vocational Fellowships operate much the same way except that members share a common bond through their vocation or profession. Their prime focus is service to others. A particular medical specialist fellowship may hold a conference in an underdeveloped country to help deal with health issues, or a Banking Fellowship may gather in a developing country to assist in working out a sound economic growth plan.

Whether recreational or vocational, then fellowships must satisfy certain criteria to be recognized by RL (1) It must have a valid purpose stated in its constitution. (2) There must be a publication of a newsletter or other forum (3) Membership must be drawn from 3 or more countries. Membership is open to all Rotarians who wish to participate.

Program

Tonight's program was a panel discussion on Y2K with panelists Lame Oulette from Wright Express on the technical aspects, Bob Danielson on the legal ramifications and Frank Butterworth on the insurance aspects of the Y2K phenomena.

Several main points about Y2K came through. First, companies must come to grips with the reality that it costs money to fix the problem and become compliant. Second, companies that you do business with must be questioned as to whether they are compliant. Third, recognition of weak links must be examined. Once these links are identified, they must be strengthened and brought up to compliance.

From the legal perspective, Congress passed a law that says if your business has made a good faith effort to become compliant, you we protected from 'Y2K liability if your systems crash and cause damage Although not a law, a suggestion was made to certify compliance with an outside consultant and get a report in writing.

From an insurance standpoint, companies that do not comply may find that their policies carry a Y2K exclusion. A good tip would be to contact your agent to find out what you need to do as a business owner not to be excluded

Lame advised, after much discussion, not to overreact but to just use common some. Thanks to Laurie, Bob and Frank for a very timely topic.

Tonight's program was about the Independent Transportation Network (ITN), which matches volunteers who transport seniors within a 15-mile radius of Portland. Currently ITN is providing 1700 rides per month. The drivers at this point are 2/3 paid and 1/3 volunteer. with a total of 100 volunteer drivers. The cost for the seniors is \$2.00 per pick up and \$.75 per mile. ITN is looking for more volunteers who can commit 3 hours a month to do this worthwhile work.

A benefit for volunteers is a chance to meet some very interesting people like a 92-year-old woman who goes weekly to Hall School to teach reading, an 81-year-old woman who cooks lunch daily for a 98-year-old women and a former teacher from Little Rock who had "Billy" Clinton in the third grade. Seniors enjoy an improved quality of life with the freedom of mobility provided by ITN.

November is Foundation month. The mission of The Rotary Foundation is to support the efforts of Rotary International to achieve world understanding and peace through international humanitarian, educational and cultural exchange programs.

The Rotary Foundation was begun in 1917 by Arch Klumph, 6th president of RI, who convinced a Rotary convention of the need for an endowment for “doing good in the world” in charitable, educational or other avenues of service.

The Rotary Foundation now funds each year:

- * immunization activities to eradicate polio from all nations of the world by year 2000.
- * approximately 1,300 scholarships for graduate, undergraduate and vocational study.
- * more than 250 Group Study Exchanges.
- * nearly 1,200 international humanitarian projects through Matching Grants, Helping Grants and Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Grants.
- * grants for university teachers to serve in developing nations other than their own.
- * more than 250 Rotary volunteers providing needed service abroad.
- * one or more Rotary Peace Programs meetings.

One referred to a poem about children striving to be like their father and how important it was that they had the opportunity to change.

The Home was the legacy of Clara Dyer's parents who endowed, in 1893, \$10,733.94 for a home to be built in the South Portland/Cape Elizabeth area for aged women. Actual construction was not started until 1914 and the home opened in 1915. At that time, the cost was \$150 for life and you had to have been a resident of South Portland or Cape Elizabeth for 10 years and be at least 60 years old. Clara Dyer and her sister were the first matrons of the Home earning the princely sum of \$15 and \$9 a week respectively.

Marianne came on board in September 1986 as the first administrator of the Home. The Home currently houses 10 residents. Men were accepted into the Home in the 1980s and there are currently 2 men in residence. The fees have climbed to \$880 a month. Marianne stressed that this was a retirement home, not a home for assisted living or a nursing care facility.

All valuables, money, passports were taken from them before they were allowed to cross the border. Arta put a human face for me on what has happened in Kosovo. To talk to her of her experiences and

what she had endured was extremely educational. How fortunate we are here! And how we take it for granted!

As I come into this New Year, my resolution is to try not to take for granted what we have in America: freedom, safety, prosperity...Rotary makes it easier to see what is happening in the world (So much of it is good!). Rotary gives us the opportunity to expand how we look at the world. And Rotary also allows us to make new friends, and have fun along the way, too. What a tremendous side benefit!!!
