the correct answers. Questions included:

- What percentage of the earth is covered with water? (Answer 70%)
- What percent of water is actually drinkable? (Answer less than 1%)
- How many people every year get stick from drinking water? (Answer over 900,000 people)
- Percentage-wise, how many people should not drink water? (Answer 20%)

Ed then discussed what his company does. Innowave provides three basic levels of filtration ranging from \$40-\$80 per month and using such techniques as UV lighting, de-ionization and distillation. One of the things that Ed pointed out was that in many cases bottled water that you purchase is actually not as healthy as ordinary tap water. Thank you, Ed, for a very interesting talk!

Technology drives banking through the use of ATM machines and the Internet, allowing consumers to have more information at their fingertips. What this means is much more competition on the horizon as more players try to sell the same products. This will lead to continued acquisitions as banks try to minimize overhead and more specialization as banks focus on segments of business they do most efficiently.

Janet intends to spend no more than \$5,000 for the primary and \$5,000 in the general election for the opportunity to represent approximately 8,000 people in most of Cape Elizabeth. What it boils down to, Janet says, is doing what feels right to you. Thank you, Dick Kilroy, for providing us with a very interesting topic tonight.
