Program - Tonight's speaker was James Sheppard, a WWII veteran and member of the Tuskegee Tuskegee Airmen denotes any African-American pilot or mechanic who was either in the training squadrons, fighter squadrons or bomber squadrons stationed in Tuskegee, Alabama during Prior to 1941, there were no African-Americans in what was then known as the Army Air Corps. President Roosevelt, by executive order, decreed that African-American troops would be trained to form initially one fighter squadron. This later evolved into four fighter squadrons and four bomber squadrons. The Airmen first saw service in North Africa and later in Sicily and Italy. Of 450 fighter pilots graduating out of Tuskegee, 100 were lost during the war. In total, almost 1,000 pilots were trained at the Air Force base, but the war ended before the bomber squadrons were committed While initially some of the white to action. commanders did not want to use them, the Tuskegee Airmen quickly gained a reputation for solid service that overcame this prejudice. <u>Program</u> - Tonight's speakers were Fred Thompson and Bob Blackwood, Co-Chairs of the Bug Light Park Shipyard Memorial Committee.

Their purpose tonight was to give the club a quick history of shipbuilding in South Portland and update the club on efforts to complete the Memorial. Shipbuilding in South Portland dates all the way back to the Revolutionary War days, through the clipper ship era, WWI and finally peaking in WWII with the liberty ship program. Just prior to the outbreak of WWII, the federal government built two shipyards; one where Bug Light Park is located and one where Spring Point Marina is located. They were known respectively as the East and West The shipyards at their peak employed 30,000 workers, 10% of which were women. The two yards combined completed a total of 30 ships for the British Navy and 236 ships for our own Merchant Marines, out of a total of 2,700 liberty ships that were built throughout the war. During this time, a ship was completed every 59 days. To commemorate this extraordinary effort, Shipyard Memorial was conceived depicting a liberty ship under construction. This Memorial will be an open-air structure with a series of panels around the ship detailing the story of the construction effort. Groundbreaking for this project is scheduled for October 13, 2001. So far, \$240,000 of the \$265,000 needed to complete the project has been raised. Thank you, Frank Gemme, for this interesting program.
