Polio Eradication - Fulfilling Our Promise

"What is Polio?" is a question many younger Rotarians and most children of Rotarians have been asking because, for most people younger than 40, polio has never been part of their lives. Polio is, of course, a highly infectious disease caused by a virus. Initial symptoms are fever, fatigue, headache, vomiting, and stiffness in the neck and pain in the limbs. The disease can cause paralysis, which is almost always irreversible. In the most severe cases, polio paralysis can lead to death by asphyxiation. The polio virus enters the body through the mouth and multiplies in the intestine. It then invades the nervous system and it can cause total paralysis in a matter of hours.

Polio Eradication - Fulfilling Our Promise

The polio eradication effort has been based on four interlocking strategies: (1) mass immunization campaigns known as National Immunization Days during which all children under 5 years of age are immunized within a few days regardless of whether they have been immunized previously. Two or more rounds of vaccinations per year will be required in each polio-endemic country. (2) effective disease surveillance known as Acute Flaccid Paralysis to find and investigate every newly paralyzed child and to determine whether or not the polio virus is the cause of the paralysis. (3) "mop up" campaigns, often house-to-house, to ensure that every child is immunized and to break the final chains of transmission. When they find a child not immunized, the workers administer the vaccine on the spot. (4) routine immunization of infants starting with four doses of polio vaccine.

The polio eradication effort by Rotary and its partners has expanded, in many countries, the capacity to fight other diseases by building effective disease reporting and surveillance systems, training epidemiologists establishing a global laboratory network. Tens of thousands of health workers have now been trained to investigate cases of paralysis and manage immunization programs. Many millions of volunteers have been trained to deliver oral polio vaccine and are now more enthusiastic about public health in general. "Coldchain," transport and communications systems for immunization have been strengthened. In 2000, over 50 countries gave Vitamin A during polio NIDs. A network of more than 140 polio laboratories has been established and could be used in the battle against other diseases. improved health network is another legacy of PolioPlus.

That the SP/CE Rotary Club is one of 53 investors who have investments totaling \$1.625 million in the **Genesis Community Loan Fund**. The directors of this fund combine these investments with their equity to create a \$2 million revolving loan pool. Over the past 10 years, Genesis has made or committed to almost \$4.5 million in loans to 82 community development projects throughout Maine, creating 555 units of affordable housing as well as numerous community facilities. Our club investment since 1995 is \$3,000, from which we receive an annual interest payment of \$75.00.

Polio Eradication - Fulfilling Our Promise

With polio eradication entering its final phase, WHO and UNICEF estimate that the amount of donor funds required for the period of 2002-2005 is US \$1 billion. There has already been pledged for committed US \$725 million. The current US \$275 million funding gap is the single greatest obstacle to eradicating the disease by the year 2005. It is in the best interests of all countries to support poor countries in their polio eradication programs so that all countries can reap the eventual benefit of US \$1.5 billion in annual savings when polio immunization can cease.

Rotary's additional US \$80 million is an important link in eliminating the funding gap. A minimum of US \$25 million of this money will be used to utilize a matching grant from the Gates Foundation, and together with assistance from the World Bank, the funding gap can be overcome.

Adrienne Murphy has pledge forms for anyone that is interested in doing so. Several members of the club have already done this and some have done considerably more. Another way to help is to work with PEC Chair Adrienne Murphy on a couple fundraisers that the club will have, with the proceeds to go to polio eradication.

Our club has made a commitment in the dollar amount of \$15,000. One of the ways to raise this money was to recommend as an option that members commit to directly contribute \$100 per year over three years. Unfortunately this information was not presented well, which led to an assumption that we were mandating individual giving. The decision to make a direct contribution to support this campaign is a voluntary one and a personal one. Contributions at any level are encouraged. If for any reason you are unable to make a direct financial contribution, it is OK. The board has identified personal giving as only one of the ways to achieve our overall commitment. We will be developing club fundraisers with the proceeds to go to this effort and would encourage your participation in these events in lieu of making a direct financial commitment. Finally, just discussing with friends, family and coworkers the efforts of Rotary to eradicate polio and raising awareness of these efforts is equally important. Thank you for your support.

Polio Eradication - Fulfilling Our Promise

Rotary International has agreed to a partnership with the World Bank, the Gates Foundation and the UN Foundation to use the World Bank's lending capacity to help nations finance polio eradication. The agreement provides that the World Bank will make an International Development Assistance loan to a nation, for polio eradication, with the foreknowledge that this loan will be paid off immediately by private sector funds, including those of Rotary. Such IDA loans, which bear no interest, can be paid off at 40% of the face value of the loan. For example, a US\$10 million purchase of oral polio vaccine for a country can be funded in the following way: US\$2 million from Rotary (or other private sector source) will be matched by US\$2 million from the Gates Foundation; this US\$4 million will be increased by the additional US\$6 million through the IDA loan. This new partnership is unique and it demonstrates the World Bank's interest in the Polio Eradication program as a model of effective private/public partnerships.
