Polio Eradication - Fulfilling Our Promise

The Rotary International Board of Directors and The Rotary Foundation Trustees fully recognize that the Polio Eradication Campaign places an extraordinary challenge before Rotarians worldwide. The Rotary leaders are confident, however, that Rotarians can and will respond to this challenge, as well as continue their outstanding support of ongoing Foundation programs.

The Trustees encourage clubs to raise community awareness - at the very grass roots level - by holding community fund raisers and involving non-Rotarians in the polio eradication effort. Members of our communities need to know of Rotary's leadership role in this global humanitarian cause and the best vehicle for public awareness is through the local Rotary club.

An excellent example of using fund raising and community awareness in tandem is the effort first initiated by the Exeter club's immediate Past President, Allison Field, in which she convinced her employer, Ocean National Bank, to contribute \$100 for each Rotarian employee to the PEC effort and to allow in each branch of the bank a display about Rotary's polio effort and inviting bank customers to make individual contributions. Other banks have taken up the challenge as well, and thanks to PDG, Marie Williams, her employer, Kennebunk Savings Bank, will be contributing \$500 for PEC to each Rotary club with a bank employee member and Kennebunk Savings Bank will also have displays in their branches. Our sincere thanks to Ocean National Bank President, Russ Cole, and to Kennebunk Savings Bank President, Joel Stevens, their outstanding commitment to polio for eradication.

The corporation has been in existence for approximately two years, which happens to be the time necessary to train a The training of service dogs is service dog. extremely pain staking. As Elsa noted, her first graduate was one of a class of 6, the other five were not able, by reasons of temperament or physicality, to become service dogs. Currently, Elsa has six dogs in training and hopes to get up to twelve dogs a year with the hopes of graduating 2 or 3. My Wonderful Dog is the only Maine-based training organization for service dogs. One of the other programs Elsa runs in connection with this is a program for troubled teens to train service dogs. Elsa herself was a graduate of such a program in San Francisco and credits it for turning her life around. The program began with 4 students a semester, working with the Spurwink School, and is now up to 8 students with two classes - one for beginners and one for advanced. Service dogs are very expensive to raise and cost the owner approximately \$2,500. However, no one who needs a dog is refused, Thank you, Adrienne, for according to Elsa. bringing Elsa to us tonight.

Polio Plus - Fulfilling Our Promise

Now is the time - this Rotary year - to finish the eradication of polio and to fulfill the promise made more than 15 years ago. Every year of delay in finding the last case of polio adds an extra US\$100-150 million in costs. This is why funding is so critical NOW!

During the years of 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2005, there must be intensified National Immunization Days and mop-up campaigns (including house-tohouse immunization); Surveillance and Certification; containment of laboratory virus stocks, strengthening of routine immunization and building a consensus strategy for stopping polio immunization.

Since 2002-2003, is the most intensified period, it is also the most expensive. The highest spending on polio activities in the regions where transmission of the virus has been interrupted was the 12-24 month period after the last case, because of the addition of mop-ups to NIDs and intensified surveillance activities.

The Hospice has a mission of improving the quality of life near the end of life and learning how to live with dying. This involves both an emotional as well as a spiritual component. When people think of hospice, they typically think of place that people go to die. Richard quickly dispelled the myth relating several stories from people with whom he has come in contact near the end of their lives, including his own father, speaking of the importance of maintaining a quality of life as well as management of pain. He has been a volunteer at the hospice for over 20 years, giving a minimum of 6 hours/week of his time, but as he noted he has received far more than he has given. Thank you, Andy Stickney, for bringing such an inspirational program to us tonight.
