On the positive side, alternate dispute resolution and prioritizing the severity of cases has helped mitigate some of the overwhelming burdens of the court system. He has seen incidents at the airport that run from the humorous "mother's a hes" (you had to be there) to the tragic. Every month, over 10,000 objects are confiscated at the airport. However, Russ said that aviation security at Logan is much safer now than it was prior to 9/11. New security scans, which program and computerized CT scans make penetrating airport security a much more difficult task for terrorists. In addition, changes are on the horizon that will modify the focus of searches from object-oriented to more person-oriented. A registered traveler program will eventually allow frequent travelers, for a nominal administrative fee, the opportunity to pass through a much lower level of security and checkpoints. 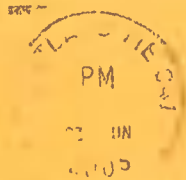
