3. What are the physical traits of the guard limited to? For a person to apply for guard duty at the tomb, he must be between 5'10" and 6'2" tall and his waist cannot exceed 30".

They must commit 2 years of life to guard the tomb, live in the barracks under the tomb and cannot drink any alcohol on or off duty for the rest of their lives.
