

Rotary aids 'Rebuilding Together'

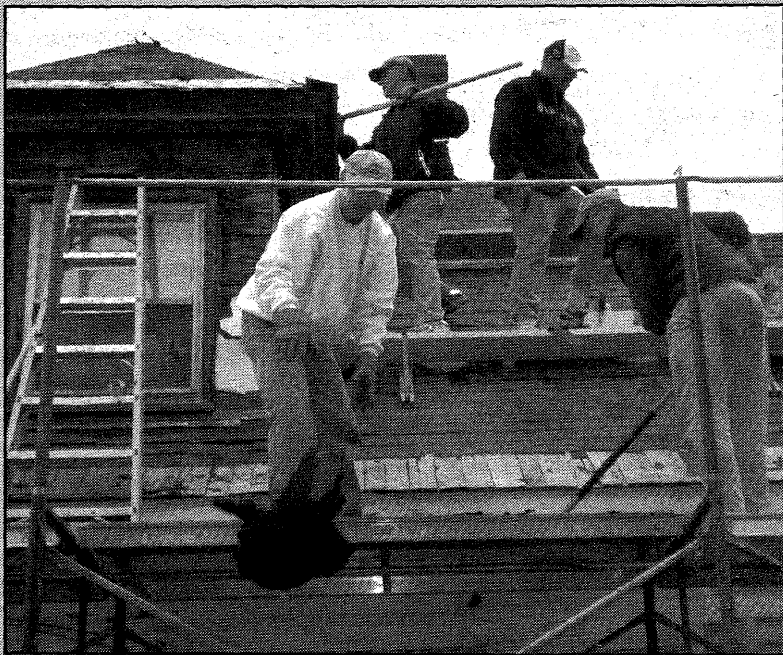
