April 10 Program - Maine Children's Home for Little Wanderers - Tonight's speaker,

Lindsay Bragdon is a licensed social worker with the Maine Children's Home for Little Wanderers. The Maine Children's Home specializes in all aspects of adoption, and also offers a teen parenting program, birth parent support services, and early childcare and education. Two of the biggest programs that they run currently are a Christmas program which distributes gifts and clothing to about sixteen hundred financially disadvantaged children in the state, and a summer camp that last year provided over 120 scholarships for children to spend a week at an overnight camp. Lindsay specializes in the adoption programs working with men and women planning for adoptions as well as birth parents.
