The Art Doctors – Bonnie and Domenico Mattozzi from the Maine Project for Fine Art Conservation (Project MEAC) spoke to us about their work in "conserving and preserving" damaged paintings. In this case a picture was worth a thousand words because you had to see the slides that they brought with them of "before" and "after" to get an appreciation of what a difference cleaning and repairing can make to an old painting. They have been doing this work for 30 years and to them, the value of the painting itself is irrelevant. It was surprising to learn that often a very old painting may be easier to clean than a newer one (e.g. late 20th century) because of the quality of the varnish. This was definitely a "you had to be there" program because the pictures were so dramatic (so check our website; Scott's email says he'll be posting more information).
