**Frank’s Foundation Figures** – Frank brought in his Foundation thermometer with current year figures colored in – we are about halfway towards our 2012-13 goal of \$11,000. Last year’s figures have all been tallied and we ended up as follows:

- Annual Fund goal - \$11,000
- Actual donations to Annual Fund - \$14,539
- Total donations (Annual Fund + PolioPlus) - \$17,462
- Members who gave (Every Rotarian Every Year) – 54
- Sustaining members (donating at least \$100) – 26

Thanks to the leadership of Frank and his sidekick Bob Carson – as well as the generosity of our club members – our club had the highest per capita giving in the district last year. Remember that it’s easy to give – just place a donation (small or large – it doesn’t matter) in the blue bag at the registration table.
