Partners for World Health Mission to Peru. Elizabeth McLellan, along with 4 of the 6 nursing students who went on the trip to Peru (Tarka, Holly, Emily and Ed) spoke about PWH and the August trip to the mountains outside of Cuzco, Peru. The team brought medical supplies and equipment rescued from the Maine waste stream with them and trained Peruvian health workers in the use of the supplies and equipment. Also providing medical services on the trip was friend-of-the-club Dr. Hector Tarazzo. This was the second mission to Peru for PWH, which has also sent missions to Tanzania, Libya during the civil war, and other countries in Africa and Latin America. The travel cost for the nursing students was partially funded by a \$3,000 donation from our club.
