<u>**Rotary Minute**</u> – Tony Wagner presented a Rotary minute explaining our club's money. We have two funds:

- 1. External Fund this is where all of our fundraising money goes. We use this money to pay for all of our charitable activities. These funds are under the control of our treasurer, Nancy Irving.
- Internal Fund this is where our annual dues, happy dollars and raffle ticket money go. It is used to pay for our district and RI dues, meals for speakers, Club Runner fees, President-Elect training, etc. These funds are overseen by our secretary Paul Butler.

By segregating our funds in this manner, we can assure ourselves and our customers/donors that 100% of the money earned by us through fundraising or donated to us is used for charitable purposes.

<u>Ready Seafood</u> What an impressive pair of young men! John and Brendan Ready told the story of how they started out as Cape Elizabeth youngsters learning to lobster from their uncle when they were 8 & 9 years old. They went on to have hundreds of traps in their teen years. While in college John won a business plan competition for entrepreneurs at Northeastern. He credited former club member Jeff Holden's endorsement of his plan in giving him the edge to win the award. The prize money helped the two of them get started in business for themselves on Commercial Street in Portland. They started out working nearly round the clock and did everything themselves. They now have 90 employees and handle about 15% of Maine's lobsters (they were too modest to mention this; Jeff H pointed it out).

They have three companies now: Ready Seafood (wholesale lobster distribution), Catch-a-Pieceof-Maine (their online business which drew them national attention), and Maine Seafood Ventures (frozen lobster products). They view the future of the lobster business as humanizing lobstering so that lobsters are not just seen as a commodity. To that end they create videos of the lobsters being caught so that the customer in a big box grocery store in Anytown USA can see their lobster being caught and hear a customized greeting from the lobsterman.
