Providing Opportunities for Youth to Grow – that's the motto of the Community Bicycle Center in Biddeford. Its director Andy Grief, a Saco-Biddeford Rotarian, told us that the Center will soon be changing its name to Shift because it's not a bike shop – it's a youth development program which helps young people at risk (mostly ages 11-14) through teaching them bike repair, going on cycling adventures and engaging in community service projects. The Center has 3 paid staff and over 115 volunteers. The Center will be fielding a team of 26 people for the Trek Across Maine next week – Andy will be riding on a 4-person tandem bike for the Trek. The Center's major fundraisers are the AppleCycle bike ride in the fall (Oct 5 this year) and a thrift shop for biking and camping gear in the basement of the Portland YMCA, co-operated with Camp Ketcha (www.portlandgearhub.org).
