**Story Time** – Diane York introduced our speaker Herb Adams who had us mesmerized with the stories that he told of Maine history. We recently marked the anniversary of two naval events which were the subject of his talk. June 26 was the  $150^{th}$  anniversary of a Confederate raid on Portland Harbor which resulted in the capture of Confederate Lt. Reed and his men, and the destruction of the US Revenue cutter *Caleb Cushing*. Although a fascinating story, we never hear about it because it was overshadowed by the events of the following week – the Battle of Gettysburg. Last week was the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the battle between the *Boxer* (British) and the *Enterprise* (US) off Monhegan Island in the War of 1812. This sad encounter was the fiercest battle of the war, and resulted in the deaths of both captains, who are buried side by side in Portland's Eastern Cemetery. It's worth noting that our Navy has had a vessel named Enterprise ever since then.
