Partnership with City of South Portland – all the details and responsibilities have been worked out. Of interest to members is that our club will not be responsible for any snow making or snow removal (hooray!)

Sponsorships – the committee is currently working on getting sponsorships and ads. Sales leaders have been assigned teams and will be coordinating asking local businesses.
