IF YOU CAN READ THIS, then be grateful that you have had the advantage of being literate and educated. Literacy is one of the six Areas of Focus of The Rotary Foundation and many clubs – including our own – support projects that promote literacy. Our speaker, Kerstin Kirchner of the Saco Bay Rotary Club, spoke about a project that her club engaged in along with a Nigerian Rotary club to help educate the children in the remote Nigerian village of Sauka. The village has about 400 children and prior to this year had no public school. The Saco Bay club bought books and school supplies with a Foundation Springboard grant (from our District) of \$4,000, plus \$6,000 of the club’s own funds. The Nigerian Rotary club broke ground on a school building in February and it will have a health clinic, a library and 6 classrooms. Both clubs plan to apply for a global grant from the Foundation to equip the health clinic and to provide toilets, showers and another water tank.
