Conflict Management – Our speaker, Claudette Thing, spoke about 5 ways of resolving conflict (“Give, Keep, Take, Talk and Listen”) and the appropriateness of each strategy in differing situations. She pointed out that conflict is an invisible cost, but it adds up to a lot. For instance, 42% of the average manager’s time is spent in conflict resolution. And chronic unresolved conflict is a deciding factor in at least 50% of employee voluntary departures and 90% of involuntary departures. Interestingly, Claudette said that at the end of mediation, she asks participants questions about how they feel about the resolution; these questions are in substance the same as the 4-Way Test:

1. Is it the Truth?
2. Is it fair to all concerned?
3. Will it build goodwill and better friendships (or relationships)?
4. Is it beneficial to all concerned?
