Board Decisions – At its meeting this week, the Board authorized spending for

- Cleaning the graffiti on the fire barn (the white paint on the back) estimated cost of \$800
- ✓ Commitment of \$1,000 for the global grant application for Healthy Kids/Brighter Future – the program in Zambia that Lonnie Hackett described to us last week.
- ✓ Donation of \$500 to the Rotary Club of Chennai (India), where they had massive flooding recently which was overshadowed in the news by the events in Paris and San Bernardino.

In response to inquiries from students, we will also be re-activating our Youth Exchange program.

We have an amazing team of dedicated volunteers who serve every bag of food and cup of coffee with dignity and compassion, but none of this would be possible without your generous support. Food insecurity is real, and the need for donations is increasing. I personally want to thank you for your kind support of the Food Cupboard. You are truly helping to change lives.

<u>"Engagement" Policy</u> – Scott reviewed the club's Engagement Policy (f/k/a Attendance Policy) at this week's meeting, with aid from our Membership Director Fran Bagdasarian. Here is the gist of it:

- * We are required to participate in 12 hours of activities every 6 months (so 24 hours/year)
- * A meeting counts as one hour.
- * At least 4 out of the 12 hours have to be actual club meetings (so 8 meetings/year).
- * For everything except club meetings, you count the actual hours that the event lasted.
- * Club committee meetings, board meetings and service projects all count.
- * District meetings and projects all count.
- * Meetings and activities of other clubs count.
- * Tree unloadings and any tree shifts in excess of the mandatory shifts count.
- * Non-Rotary service projects do not count (if it wasn't announced at a club meeting or published in the bulletin then it probably isn't a club project).
- * Notwithstanding the above minimum requirements, Rotary is a social club as well as a service organization we enjoy each other's company so attendance at meetings is encouraged.
