<u>How Close Are We</u> – THIS CLOSE!! Margaret Chan, the head of the WHO, made the official announcement on Friday that polio has been eradicated in Nigeria. Furthermore according to Bob Scott, former Rotary International Polio Committee chair and one of the speakers at the Zone Institute, in the past 6 months there have been only 19 cases of polio. <u>Sinking Our Teeth In</u> – Our program this week was a fascinating classification talk by longtime member Dave Bagdasarian. (*Unfortunately I started writing the bulletin on Thursday before I left for Providence and somewhere along the way I misplaced my notes from Wednesday night so I'm going from memory here.*) Dave started out with some fun facts about dentistry such as

- Flossing is much more important than brushing.

He then went on to tell us about the history of dentistry, including some of the more recent advances (such as sit-down dentistry, which makes the job much easier). The rest is history – Dave remained in Maine and joined Rotary, much to our benefit.
