<u>New Paul Harris Fellow</u> – At last week's meeting, our club honored Nancy Miles as a Paul Harris Fellow. Time did not permit reading aloud the introduction that had been prepared describing what a Paul Harris Fellow is, and Nancy's many qualifications for the honor, so I am sending that to you separately. At the same time, we presented a check for \$2,000 to Judy's Pantry. In accepting the award – and the check – Nancy noted that Judy's Pantry is in its 6th year

and it serves 115 individuals (including 55 children, 17 seniors and 7 single parents). Many of their customer have significant health issues. Judy's Pantry originally started as a produce pantry in the summer, offering healthy food grown in local gardens, but has now expanded to a year-round food pantry. Our donation, along with donations from the Lions, Cape Business Alliance and individuals allows them to buy food to accomplish this goal.

District Governor Visit – In last week's bulletin we learned all about District Governor Sheila Rollins' many past careers & accomplishments. What she didn't publish and I learned Saturday evening (see article above) is that she can really cut a rug!! We also learned last week that Sheila IS technically competent and went to the time and trouble of fishing through our website and Facebook page for pictures of our club at work, and worked them into her very well-done PowerPoint presentation. Since we already know what we do, I'll skip over that part of the program and tell you about the District projects she is enthusiastic about:

- ✓ International Literacy Project the district is collecting books for the Jada Special Education Center in Nigeria. The plan is to send 1000 books – our club made a donation of \$300 towards this effort in honor of her visit to our club.
- ✓ Local Literacy Project "Rotary Reads" this project collects books and then distributes them to clubs to donate to local schools, libraries, etc.
- ✓ Anti-Hunger Initiative this event is planned for March and will focus on hunger in the elderly stay tuned later in the year for more details.
- ✓ Polio Walk the district will be repeating the very successful Polio Bridge Walk in Portsmouth again this year – the date will be Saturday, October 24, to coincide with World Polio Day – mark your calendars!
- ✓ Vocational Training Team our District will be sending a team of mental health professionals to Argentina to participate in an exchange.
- ✓ Child Anti-Slavery Initiative Sheila is very passionate about the issue of human trafficking and was horrified to learn how widespread this is. On October 30 our district will be collaborating with at least 3 other organizations to hold an event called "Dress Up to Drive Out Slavery." Again, mark your calendars!

In last week's bulletin I mentioned that Sheila had been an aspiring politician. She attended her first Rotary meeting while campaigning for office, and as she says, she "lost the election, but won Rotary." How fortunate for Rotary!
