<u>A Presentation that was "squeaky" clean??</u> - One of your fellow club members wanted me to use that pun in the bulletin (I won't embarrass Bob Knupp by telling you who). Anyway our speaker Luann Ballesteros from Jackson Laboratory drove all the way down from Bangor in the snow – and back – to speak to us last night! Many of us remembered Luann from when she spoke to us a couple years ago and gave us the tip that we should all be eating blueberries! The research they are doing at Jackson Labs is fascinating – for instance Luann explained how they could implant tumors in mice that would allow them to test to see which drug would be most effective in treating that tumor. The lab ships millions of mice each year to research facilities around the world. As a non-profit, Jackson Labs is able to conduct research on rare diseases as well as more pervasive diseases such as cancer and Alzheimer's. Luann also stressed the vital impact that Jackson Labs has on the state of Maine's economy. It was a real treat to get this firsthand update on the cutting edge research that is going on right here in Maine.

Opportunities Available! – Even though I editorialized above and suggested maybe Nicole would like to serve on the Veterans Committee, she is not obligated to and in fact there are many opportunities to serve the club for our new members as well as existing members.
