<u>Worth Repeating (and so typically Sybil!)</u> – Here is the last Q&A in the interview with Sybil Riemensnider which appeared in last week's Sentry:

Q: Did you have any children of your own?

A: No. My husband and I were late bloomers. He was 44 and I was 34 when we married. People said it wouldn't work, that I was too independent and set in my ways by then. But it worked out just fine. So, no, we never had any children – every youngster who got a healthy meal from us over the past 20 years – those have been my children.

<u>Breaking News</u> – Many of you remember Lonnie Hackett but to refresh you, he is an *extraordinary* 25-year-old graduate of Bowdoin College. While his fellow alumni are clawing their way up the corporate ladder and enjoying avocado toast, he has been in Zambia establishing and proliferating a health program (Healthy Kids/Brighter Future) that trains teachers to be frontline healthcare workers in preventing and treating medical problems. So far the program covers 30,000 students and Lonnie has no plans of stopping there.

While originally planning to attend Harvard Medical School to become a doctor, his work in Zambia has convinced him to aim for a Master's in Public Health at Oxford. Several Rotary clubs – including ours, with a contribution of \$1,000 – have collaborated to apply for a global grant to provide a scholarship for Lonnie to attend graduate school at Oxford. (Those who have been in Rotary a while may remember that the Foundation used to have an Ambassadorial Scholarship program but now the only way to apply for a scholarship through the Foundation is through the Peace Fellowships or a global grant.) We learned this morning in an email from Claudia Frost of the Brunswick club that *the grant has been approved!* Here is part of her email to Bill: "I received a hurried email last evening from Lonnie who was simultaneously notified of the approval and he was thrilled and grateful to all the donors who made it possible for him to attend Oxford University facing a very small amount of debt."
