Bug Light News – As part of our role as lighthouse "keepers," last summer we removed some of the broken palmetto leaf decorations at the top of the lighthouse and had molds made so that we could re-cast new parts. The replacement parts have been received and they are being painted this week. In the coming weeks they will be affixed to the lighthouse so it will once again be intact.

In other lighthouse news, we will be opening up the lighthouse for the Kite Festival on Saturday, May 20. Consider being a docent/tour guide at this event – it's an easy job – just chatting with people and giving information about the lighthouse (script is provided) – plus you will have a fantastic view!

<u>Show & Tell</u> – Our speaker this week was South Portland Chief of Police Ed Googins. Chief Googins brought along some show & tell items to highlight some of the issues that face the department:

 $\underline{Narcan} - 2$ doses of Narcan are now standard equipment for all police officers. There were 7 fatal drug overdoses in SP last year and many more which were not fatal. The police officers are not thrilled about administering medical intervention but they realize that they need to because of

this statistic. The chief has included funding for a behavioral health liaison in next year's budget to provide follow-up on mental health and substance use disorder cases.

<u>Body Camera</u> – the department recently acquired body cameras that integrate with the video that had already been installed in police cruisers many years ago. The video from the body cameras helps the community and prosecutors to know what actually happened. A victim can always ask to have the camera turned off (but a suspect can't!).

There was a lively Q&A session following Chief Googins' presentation – we all came away with a much keener awareness of the issues facing law enforcement.
