My sincere thanks to all members for their hard work: Tom Meyers, Tony Wagner, Paul Butler, Doug Schauf, Bob Knupp. Each member of the committee has worked diligently to provide needed assistance to Maine's homeless veterans and to our contacts at the Maine V.A. And heartfelt thanks also to Club members who have supported these efforts with Club funds and other assistance.

Togus, Maine, who also provided the distribution priorities/percentages to be spent from our total budget.

As we learned this summer, the district will be presenting an award to any club which completes 10 of the specified projects, as well as participating in National Reading Day on March 2. Our club is well on its way, already having completed:

- ✓ Funding high school scholarships

- ✓ Sponsoring the Interact clubs at our 2 high schools
